#### **Course Description**

This course is designed to provide the master's level student in speech language pathology with understanding of the complex issues surrounding the treatment of voice disorders, including etiological theories, therapy delivery models, clinical decision making, parameters of research and interdisciplinary considerations.

#### **Course Learning Outcomes (CLO)**

This course meets the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA) 2014 Standards and Implementation Procedures for the Certificate of Clinical Competence in Speech-Language Pathology IV-C and IV-D in the area of fluency and voice disorders and differences.

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Identify and discuss the nature, prevention, assessment and intervention of voice disorders and differences (ASHA Standard IV-C and IV-D; quizzes, exams, and treatment project)
- 2. Conduct voice assessment and identify appropriate laryngeal, perceptual, aerodynamic and/or acoustic assessment methods (ASHA Standard IV-D; labs, quiz and skill exam)

3. Develop appropriate treatment plan and rationale for managing a voice case (ASHA Standard IV-D; treatment project)

## **Course Requirements and Assignments**

**Readings**. The selected readings provide rationale, implementation detail, and research evidence to increase the breadth and depth of some topics covered in class. Information from these readings will augment your performance.

Labs (30%). There are three lab activities that provide hands-on learning to facilitate knowledge and skill development in assessment and intervention of voice. Labs are graded based on successful completion and timely submission of the assigned practice and worksheets. All labs are due by midnight (11:59pm) BEFORE the next class, unless otherwise instructed. (CLO 1 and 2)

1. Auditory perception: 10%

2. Assessment: 10%3. Treatment: 10%

Quizzes (20%). There are seven online quizzes. Each quiz is timed (30 minutes) and limited to one attempt only. The quizzes require locked-down browser. All quizzes are due by **midnight** (11:59pm) **BEFORE** the **next class**, unless otherwise instructed. The score is calculated by combining all quizzes, dropping the lowest score. (CLO 1-3)

**Midterm Exam (25%).** There is one online mid-term exam. The exam is timed (90 minutes) and limited to one attempt only. The exam will be **available on the scheduled date from 4-7pm**. The exam requires locked-down browser and may include audio/video clips and images. Choose a quiet room with steady internet connection, and use appropriate laptop/desktop/headphones. Students are expected to perform independently and ethically. (CLO 1)

**Skill Exam (5%).** There is one in-class skill-based exam on Ax/Tx. Each student will be asked to perform a common Ax or Tx task, randomly selected by the instructor. A list of skills will be provided.

**Voice Treatment Project (20%).** This is an individual project on voice intervention. The instructor will randomly assign each student a voice case. Each student will research and develop an appropriate treatment plan, supported with rationale and materials. This final project is due by the end of the scheduled final exam time. Details will be provided on Canvas. (CLO 3)

**Final Evaluation.** The culminating experience is the final project on clinical management of a voice case. The project is due by the end of the scheduled final exam time.
