ANNOUNCEMENT OF SUMMER TEACHIING OPPORTUNITY
Summer 2010
Specialization – Graduate Level Taxation
(subject to budget approval)

Qualifications: The applicant must have experience teaching graduate level tax courses, high quality teaching skills, and meet SJSU's definition of academically qualified (AQ) per AACSB accreditation standards (see [URL] for details; qualifications include possessing a PhD, JD or MST, and at least 2 peer reviewed journal articles in appropriate publications since 2006). Experience teaching S corporations, estate and gifts, IRS practice & procedure, and/or taxation of tax-exempt organizations.

Responsibilities: Prepare and teach 1 or 2 MST courses in summer 2010 (mid-June to mid-August 2010). Class meetings are 4 hours and are scheduled for one evening per week for 8 weeks + 2 Saturday mornings. Classes meet in San Jose. Must adhere to scheduling, grading and other instructional policies of SJSU and the College of Business. Course syllabus needed by March 2010.

Salary Range: Commensurate with qualifications and experience. A research grant may also be available in addition to teaching (depending on timing, interest, research area and co-authoring possibilities). Salary information is available at <http://www.fa.sjsu.edu/>.

Employment Period: Class session runs approximately mid-June 2010 to mid-August 2010

Eligibility: Employment is contingent upon proof of eligibility to work in the United States.
