OTHER ECON ELECTIVES

Beginning Fall 2003, all new and transferring students complete 12 units of Other Econ Electives. Student enrolled before Fall 2003 complete 9 units Up to 3 units of Accounting can be used to satisfy the requirements for Economics Electives. Check with an advisor.

Each course used to satisfy the requirements for the major MUST be completed with a minimum grade of C-. Also an overall GPA of 2.0 is required in the major. Economics 109 may not be included in the major, but may be included in a double major. At least 12 upper division units in the Economics major must be taken in residence. General Education Requirements (48 units); Physical Education (2 units); Requirements for the Major (42 units); Any Electives (28 units); Total 120 units.
