Ms. Stiller is a Ph.D. Candidate and a Lecturer in the Department of History, University of Hannover. She received an M.A. in History, Sociology, and Political Science from the same university. With a Charles H. Revson Foundation fellowship, Ms. Stiller conducted research for her dissertation project, "The 'Volkstumspolitik' of the SS, 1939-1945."

Ms. Stiller is the author of several essays in German anthologies on World War II-era Germany, focusing most recently on the RuSHA Case of the Nuremberg Subsequent Proceedings. Ms. Stiller's research will reveal a greater understanding of the 'Final Solution' and its connection to the Germanization of living space and the National Socialist "new order."

She is the recipient of research grants and scholarships from the German Historical Institute in Warsaw, the Heinrich Boell Foundation, and the German Historical Institute in Washington, D.C. She has also had internships at the U.S. National Archives and Record Administration and the Federal Archives in Berlin.
