Qualifications: Required: A doctorate in elementary teacher education or a related field, such as Curriculum and Instruction, with additional expertise in one or more of the following areas: educational or developmental psychology as it relates to teaching and learning, educational foundations, classroom management, assessment, or second language learners in K-8 schools. Demonstrated ability to teach using new technological tools, including but not limited to Learning Management Systems such as Blackboard, Angel, Desire2Learn, etc. Knowledge of K-8 public school subject matter standards, curricula and assessment models. For appointment at the advanced rank, must have broad teaching experience and demonstrate significant scholarly and professional achievements. Applicants should have awareness of and sensitivity to the educational goals of a multicultural population as might have been gained in cross-cultural study, training, teaching and other comparable experience.

Preferred: Expertise in teaching science or math in K-8 settings. Experience teaching using a range of instructional technologies to meet specific learning needs of culturally and linguistically diverse K-8 students. Experience in using a range of strategies to reach diverse students and to create environments that support differentiated teaching and learning. Proficiency in one or more languages present in the SJSU service area. Experience with grant writing. Successful experience in developing partnerships with schools and in providing professional development to K-8 teachers serving culturally and linguistically diverse student populations.

Responsibilities: Teach courses in foundations of education and/or curriculum methods, supervise student - teachers, and/or teach master's level courses in Curriculum & Instruction, and participate in student advisement. Maintain an active research program with potential to teach and direct research of MA candidates. Serve on department, College and university committees, and contribute to program and curriculum development. Candidate must address the needs of a student population of great diversity – in age, cultural background, ethnicity, primary language and academic preparation - through course materials, teaching strategies and academic advisement.
