Although the steps are presented in numerical order, keep in mind that you may not necessarily complete all of these steps in the order that they are presented. Refer to your MySJSU student account for specific deadlines and tasks that need to be completed to ensure your enrollment.

Stay Committed to the Process

There are consequences if you miss deadlines. Deadlines are very important in the U.S. and are in place to help you through the enrollment process. You risk having your admission withdrawn if you do not meet our deadlines and maintain your eligibility. To avoid this from happening, sign in to your MySJSU student account every few days and thoroughly read any messages, "To Do List" items or posted deadlines and take the requested action as soon as possible.

Submit Your Intent to Enroll

San José State will need to know if you plan on attending for Fall 2017. Once the Next Steps Intent to Enroll website (<https://nextsteps.sjsu.edu>) opens on **Wednesday, February 1, 2017**, tell us your plans. The process includes accepting SJSU's offer of admission, signing up for any necessary placement exams, signing up for mandatory orientation, and paying for orientation.

YES – I intend to enroll at SJSU for the Fall 2017 semester.
(**Please note:** You may not defer your enrollment to a later semester.)

NO – I will not attend SJSU for the Fall 2017 semester.
(Your application will be withdrawn from further consideration.)

You will need the following to submit your intent to enroll:

- Your nine-digit SJSU ID (provided on your Letter of Admission)
- PIN (month and day of your birth date). For example, January 21 is 0121.

You must complete the multi-step Next Steps Intent to Enroll process by 11:59 p.m. (Pacific Standard Time) on **Monday, May 1, 2017** or your admission will be withdrawn.

Sign Up for Required Placement Exams

English and Math Exams

All lower division transfer applicants are required to complete placement tests in both math and English, unless exempt. These placement tests are called the Entry Level Mathematics (ELM) exam and the English Placement Test (EPT). Students can be exempt from these exams by scores earned on other appropriate tests such as the SAT, ACT, Advanced Placement (AP), and A and AS Level Exams (Math only). Students who are exempt, must provide proof prior to completing their Intent to Enroll.

You will not be allowed to register for any classes until we receive proof of exemption or test scores for the ELM and EPT. Students have three options for taking the ELM and EPT:

Option 1: Take the ELM/EPT at any of the 23 California State Universities by **Saturday, May 6, 2017**. Visit ets.org/csu/registration/dates for a full list of testing locations and dates.

Option 2: Take the ELM/EPT in another U.S. state other than California, or outside the U.S., by **Sunday, June 11**. SJSU must receive test scores in time for course registration. There is an additional fee for testing outside of California. For questions regarding out-of-state testing, please call 1-925-808-2142 or email csuoutofstate@ets.org. Visit ets.org/csu/registration/dates to register.

Option 3: Take the ELM/EPT at SJSU on **Friday, August 11**. This option is specifically created for students who do not test prior to entering the U.S. Please note that taking the exam(s) on this date will affect your registration for courses because ELM/EPT scores are required to register for courses at SJSU.

You will be registered for this test date automatically if you do not sign up for the above options. You will receive a MySJSU message about a week prior to the test date with information to pay and where to take the test. Importance of Exams

Be aware, the scores you earn on the EPT and ELM exam could cause you to be placed into mandatory remedial courses during your first year at SJSU. Since this can impact the length of time it will take you to earn your degree, we strongly recommend that you prepare for these exams. Department Placement Exams

Many new undergraduates in the College of Science, Engineering and Business may need to take the Calculus Placement Exam prior to registration. For details, exemptions, and other criteria, visit sjsu.edu/math/calculus

Exemptions

To determine if you are exempt from taking the EPT and ELM exam, consult your status in step two of the Intent to Enroll process (<https://nextsteps.sjsu.edu>). If the exemption status displayed in your account does not match your actual exemption status, this means that SJSU does not have all of your official test scores on file. You must send us all official test scores that prove your exemption status or we will require you to take the placement exams. Learn more at ets.org/s/csu/pdf/csu_information_bulletin.pdf

English Placement Test (EPT) Exemptions

If SJSU does not have official test scores from you that meet one of the following exemption categories, you will be required to take the EPT.

National Standardized Tests

SAT 500 or higher on the critical reading section

ACT: 22 or higher on the English test

AP: 3 or higher on the Language & Composition or Literature & Composition Tests

IB: 4 or higher on the English Language A1 HL

CLEP: 50 or higher on the College Composition or College Composition Modular test

Community College Credit

Complete a course that satisfies Area A-2 (Written Communication) of General Education with a grade of "C-" or higher

Entry Level Mathematics (ELM) Exemptions

If SJSU does not have official test scores from you that meet one of the following exemption categories, you will be required to take the ELM exam.

National Standardized Tests

SAT 550 or higher on SAT I Mathematics Reasoning or SAT II Mathematics Level IC or IIC

ACT: 23 or higher on the mathematics test

AP: 3 or higher on the Statistics, Calculus AB or BC test

IB: 4 or higher on the Math HL

CLEP: 50 or higher on the Calculus, College Algebra, College Math, Pre-Calculus test

Advanced Subsidiary (AS) and Advanced (A) level exams with grade of "C" or higher in Math

Community College Credit

Complete a course that satisfies Area B-4 (Quantitative Reasoning - Math) of General Education with a grade of "C-" or higher

Educational Testing Services (ETS) – Exempt Status

If Educational Testing Services (ETS) says you are exempt from taking the ELM or EPT and your Next Steps Intent to Enroll (<https://nextsteps.sjsu.edu>) account does not reflect the same exemption status, contact the SJSU Testing Office immediately at testing-office@sjsu.edu

Sign Up for Transfer Orientation

Transfer Orientation is a mandatory one-day program that will acquaint you with the campus, introduce you to your college and major department, and provide you with critical academic planning information. All admitted students must attend the entire program. (Guests are not permitted.)

If you do not attend or leave during any portion of the event, you will be blocked from registering for classes and will not be able to attend SJSU in Fall 2017. Students who arrive late will not be allowed to attend the program.

- Discuss and explain key university services.
- Review what's next before you start classes.
- Help you plan your academic schedule.
- Provide a General Education advising workshop.
- Explain general education requirements and preparation for the Writing Skills Test.

If you would like to stay on campus while attending SJSU, you must complete a housing application for either University Housing Services or the International House, depending on where you prefer to stay for the 2017-18 school year. More details about your options and the application processes are below. (Please note there is a separate application for the International House.)

University Housing Services

We strive to provide supportive and affordable residential learning communities that promote academic success and individual development. Our living-learning communities help ease the transition to college life, serve as an extension of the classroom, and increase awareness of community responsibility. Located on the main San José State campus, the residence halls are just minutes from classes, the library, recreation and dining facilities, and downtown.

Within the residence halls, we offer a variety of communities to bring students together who have similar interests. Programming is designed around student interests and often has a component tied to a SJSU academic department. Students who live on campus have the opportunity to get involved in social gatherings, cultural events, intramural sports, community service, and a wide range of other campus activities.

1. A completed online University Housing application
2. A \$50 non-refundable application fee
3. A \$600 initial payment

Room/Apartment Assignment

We encourage you to complete the online housing application and submit payments as soon as possible. You must complete your online application (electronically signed license agreement and \$50 application fee) and submit the \$600 initial payment by **Saturday, April 1, 2017** to be included in the first round of housing assignments. You may also complete your online housing application and submit payments any time after this date as long as space remains available. Your room/apartment assignment will be made on a first-paid, first-served basis after April 1.

International House

A large, comfortable home located near campus, the International House (I-House) is a co-ed residence for 70 U.S. and international students attending San José State. At I-House, residents find friends, study partners, and mentors in addition to opportunities for leadership, group activities and travel. I-House students represent approximately 25 countries, range in age from 17 to 35 years of age, study in a wide variety of programs offered on the SJSU campus, and enroll in graduate, undergraduate, and English language programs.

I-House offers a one-semester contract and stays open year-round with per diem rates during summer and winter breaks. As much as possible, roommates are matched according to compatible interests and personal habits. After the first semester at the International House, residents have the opportunity to choose a roommate and designate a preferred room.

All furniture, utilities, TV, internet access and computer equipment, as well as use of a fully-equipped kitchen, are included. Students interested in living in the I-House must send a separate application directly to the I-House. There is no application fee. Applications are available at sjsu.edu/ihouse



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Purchase Health Insurance

SJSU requires all students to have medical insurance, and all international students are required to purchase the SJSU health insurance coverage prior to registering for classes. You can register for the mandatory SJSU health insurance online. To enroll, go to <http://studentinsurance.wellsfargo.com> then, select "Find Your School Plan" and type "San Jose State University." Select "2016-2017 San Jose State Univ.- International." You can buy your insurance for the year, or for a semester at a time. Immunization

As a new student, you will need to provide proof of Measles (sjsu.edu/studenthealth/requirements/measles-rubella) and Hepatitis B (sjsu.edu/studenthealth/requirements) immunizations prior to enrollment. If you don't have documentation, go to the SJSU Health Center to get your shots and proof of immunizations. Bring the forms to the Student Services Center or fax them to 408-924-2077.

Immigration Session (Mandatory)

Students must attend the Immigration session, which occurs during Transfer Orientation. Following your Transfer Orientation session, check in with International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS) office in Clark Hall Room 543 to:

- Learn about F-1 benefits
- Maintain your legal non-immigrant status in the U.S.
- Complete your immigration transfer from another U.S. institution to SJSU, as applicable

Submit Final Transcripts and Documents

Continue to check your MySJSU “To Do List” for transcript and document deadlines. We will look at your final transcript to verify that you completed all required courses for admission. This includes passing required courses with a C- or better. Final transcripts must include your graduation date and must be submitted by the date listed on your MySJSU account To Do List. If you have AP, IB, AS, A level or CLEP exam results, please have official test results sent to SJSU.

How to Submit Transcripts and Documents

Transcripts/Mark Sheets: Transcripts with final grades for all courses must be submitted to maintain your eligibility to enroll. If you earned a degree from the institution(s) you attended, the transcript must show proof of your degree completion, including the graduation date.

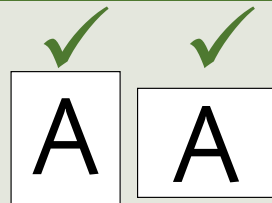
Test Scores (TOEFL, IELTS, Advanced Subsidiary/A Level, AP exams, SAT and ACT) and IB diploma must also be sent directly to SJSU from the testing agency.

To speed up transcript processing time you are highly encouraged to request that your institution send electronic transcripts to San Jose State University. If you must have your transcripts mailed, please make sure that the name on your application matches the name listed on your transcripts. All transcripts must be sealed and unopened to be accepted as official documents. PLEASE NOTE: COPIES OF TRANSCRIPTS OR OPENED TRANSCRIPTS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

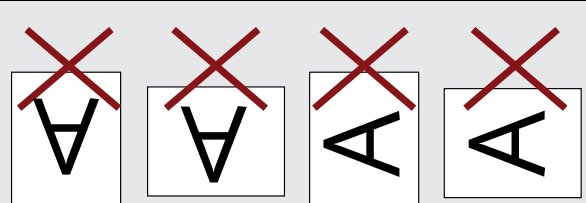

All other documents (bank statement, Declaration of Finance, and photocopy of current passport) can be mailed or submitted electronically in individual PDF formatted files (one PDF for each requested document). If possible, please submit them electronically (PDF only) to sa-adm-wrkflow@sjsu.edu

The following are steps for submitting items by email.

- Convert documents to PDF format. Free PDF converters are available at primopdf.com or freepdfconvert.com
- Make sure the documents are readable, with your name or the name of your institution at the top of the page, and in individual files (one PDF per document).
- Include your nine-digit SJSU ID and your first and last name as it appears on your passport in the BODY of the email message.
- Email the attachments to sa-adm-wrkflow@sjsu.edu. One email may contain multiple PDF files, but please do not send the PDF files as a Zip file.

Pay Your Tuition and Fees

Fees are due after registering for your classes. To see your payment due date, check your MySJSU account under the “Finances” section. You have the option to pay in full or sign up for a payment plan. For details, visit sjsu.edu/bursar

Fees Are Subject to Change

The CSU makes every effort to keep student costs to a minimum. Fees listed in published schedules or student accounts may need to be increased when public funding is inadequate. Therefore, CSU must reserve the right, even after fees are initially charged or initial fee payments are made, to increase or modify any listed fees. All listed fees, other than mandatory systemwide fees, are subject to change without notice, until the date when instruction for a particular semester or quarter has begun. All CSU listed fees should be regarded as estimates that are subject to change upon approval by the Board of Trustees, the Chancellor, or the Presidents, as appropriate. Changes in mandatory systemwide fees will be made in accordance with the requirements of the Working Families Student Fee Transparency and Accountability Act (Sections 66028 - 66028.6 of the Education Code).

Financing Your Education

Please note that international students are not eligible for financial aid at SJSU and that off-campus work authorization in the United States is difficult to obtain.

Fee Payment Deadlines

After you register, sign in to your MySJSU account to view the amount you owe and your payment due date. SJSU does not send invoices to students. It is your responsibility to check your MySJSU account to keep current with your account. Failure to pay by the deadline will result in your classes being dropped. For more information about payment methods, including international wire transfer, fees and payment due dates visit sjsu.edu/bursar

If a Third Party Sponsor, such as a foreign government agency, a business and/or educational institution, agrees to sponsor you by paying your tuition and fees, please get a letter from the sponsor stating how much of your tuition they will cover and for which semesters. Submit the letter to SJSU’s Bursar’s Office and retain a copy of the letter for your records. SJSU will then send an invoice to your sponsor for payment. International Wire Transfers

International students can now make payments via international wire transfer through their MySJSU account. San José State University has partnered with flywire to streamline the tuition payment process for our international students. flywire offers excellent foreign exchange rates, allowing you to pay in your home currency (in most cases) and save a significant amount of money, compared to traditional banks. You will be able to track the progress of your payment throughout the transfer process via a student dashboard, and you will also be notified via email when your payment is received by San José State.

There is no fee charged by SJSU or flywire for international wire transfers. The bank you use to send the wire transfer usually charges a fee, so check with that bank for the fee schedule. Learn more at sjsu.edu/bursar/payment_refunds/methods/international_wire_transfer.

Field Trip Fees

A few courses have additional field trip fees ranging from \$11.00 to \$52.00.

Special or Optional Fees

Parking permits are available for students. A daily one-semester parking permit is estimated at \$192.00.

Refunds

Students are highly encouraged to enroll in Direct Deposit. With Direct Deposit, you receive your refund several days quicker than a paper check. To enroll, login to MySJSU, scroll to Finances, and select Enroll in Direct Deposit. To learn more visit sjsu.edu/bursar

Keeping Your MySJSU Account Current

SJSU has established a business practice whereby all payments apply to the oldest debt on your account. For example, if you are making a registration payment and you have a housing debt with an earlier due date, the payment will apply to the housing charges first. Keep your account current to avoid the possibility of enrollment cancellation.

Any delinquent outstanding charges owed to the university will be submitted to the Franchise TaxBoard for tax refund offset. The university or its agent has the right to pursue collections in order to repay a delinquent debt owed to the university

Frequently Asked Questions

What if I do not complete required courses or miss a deadline?

You will have your admission to SJSU revoked and your registration canceled. Failure to submit your transcript will result in your application being withdrawn, even if you have signed up for housing and attended orientation.

What if I am taking courses required for admission during the fall term?

You may not use coursework from the fall term to complete admission requirements.

Can I defer my admission to another term?

No, your admission is good for one term only. If you wish to be considered for a later term, you must submit a new application for the next available term for which you meet the minimum requirements.

What if I'm a California Community College transfer?

- Keep your own copy of the general education plan from your community college.
- Keep track of the courses you've completed to meet the GE requirements. Work with our Academic Advisors to choose SJSU courses to complete remaining courses.

Can I change my major?

Due to space limits in many SJSU departments, you may not change your major before the term starts. Note that change of major is never guaranteed, even after admission to SJSU.

Student Responsibilities and Rights

F–1 Visas

Coming from a U.S. Institution

Prior to the end of your last semester, you must have your current school transfer your F-1 electronic record in the SEVIS database to SJSU. To complete this process, you must do the following: Show your admission letter and the SJSU "Transfer In Form" to your current school's international office. You can find the form at sjsu.edu/isa/forms under SJSU "Transfer In Form". Complete the top section of the form and ask the school to complete the remaining sections and fax the form to 408–924–2035. Complete your Immigration Document Check–In at the International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS) office at SJSU. For more information, visit sjsu.edu/iss

Coming from Outside the U.S.

You will receive a Form I-20 (Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant Student Status) directly from San José State in the mail with your letter of admission. To start the process to obtain an F–1 student visa first complete the I–901 form online through SEVIS at ice.gov/sevis/i901 then pay the SEVIS fee and print out the receipt.

To obtain your F–1 visa, make an appointment for a visa interview and complete the visa application process with the nearest U.S. Consulate. Be sure to have the following documents at the time of your visa interview:

- Your current passport (must be valid for at least six months at the time of your entry into the U.S.)
- SJSU admission letter
- Your Form I-20 (Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant Student Status) issued by SJSU
- Proof (receipt) of SEVIS fee payment (I - 901 receipt)
- Proof of financial support, and resources reflected on the Form I-20 issued by SJSU
