Rank: Assistant/Associate professor, tenure track

Qualifications:

1. Doctorate required, BOC certified in good standing with specialization in Athletic Training;
2. Demonstrated ability to teach athletic training courses. Successful candidate will direct the Post-Certification Graduate Athletic Training Education Program, chair/serve on thesis committees, supervise clinical experiences, teach and advise graduate and undergraduate students;
3. Three years teaching and research experience as a full-time faculty member is required for appointment at Assistant Professor level. In order to be eligible for appointment at the advanced rank, must have broad teaching experience and demonstrate scholarly/professional achievement commensurate with such rank;
4. Knowledge and understanding of athletic training room, as well as related equipment, instruments and procedures;
5. Ability to work collegially with fellow professionals in the maintenance and development of the graduate and undergraduate athletic training programs;
6. Ability to work with colleagues to continue developing a contemporary interdisciplinary research and teaching approach at both the undergraduate and graduate levels, with special interest in medical fitness and physical activity, or similar;
7. Understanding of the nature and role of the discipline of Kinesiology, and ability to make contributions to the department as a whole as well as across disciplinary boundaries;
8. Maintain membership in appropriate professional associations;
9. Experience and background working in a metropolitan university setting; and
10. Applicants should have awareness of and sensitivity to the educational goals of a multicultural population as might have been gained in cross-cultural study, training, teaching or other comparable experience.

Responsibilities:

1. Teach in and direct the Post-Certification Graduate Athletic Training Education Program;
2. Conduct research, develop grants, present professional papers, and publish in professional journals, incorporating an interdisciplinary focus;
3. Supervise practicum/clinical experiences, chair/serve on thesis/project committees and advise students at the undergraduate/graduate levels;
4. Engage in community and university outreach to maintain athletic training practicum/clinical experience sites, and generate community support and involvement, with a possible fundraising outcome;
5. Possibly teach in the undergraduate or graduate Kinesiology major programs, general education or activity programs;
6. Apply knowledge and skills using an interdisciplinary approach to Kinesiology, especially with regard to medical fitness and physical activity, or similar;
7. Integrate and build bridges across the sub-disciplines within Kinesiology and serve to interface programs with other departments across the University;
8. Serve on department, college and university committees as appropriate; and
9. Address the needs of a student population of great diversity - in age, cultural background, ethnicity, primary language and academic preparation - through course materials, teaching strategies and advisement.
