**Minimum Qualifications:\***

Prior teaching experience preferred; interest in and record of scholarly activity desirable. Ph.D. or A.B.D. in History or affiliated discipline; M.A. with extensive and relevant teaching experience also considered.

Applicants should have awareness of and sensitivity to the educational goals of a multicultural population as might have been gained in cross-cultural study, training, teaching and other comparable experience

**Brief Description of Duties:**

Teach undergraduate lecture courses in Art History such as ARTH 10 (Introduction to Visual Culture), ARTH 11 (20<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup> Centuries). ARTH 11 is a course required for B.A./BFA majors in Fine Arts who enroll in foundation courses such as ART 12 (2-D) or ART 13 (3-D) or Photo 40 (Introduction to Photography) as co-requisites. ARTH 10 is a course for non-art/design majors. Hold regular office hours. Work cooperatively with art history program coordinator, art history faculty, other faculty in the School of Art & Design, staff. Participate in course assessment activities, especially for general education courses.

Candidates must address the needs of a student population of great diversity-in age, cultural background, ethnicity, primary language and academic preparation-through course materials, teaching strategies and advisement.
