Candidates must address the needs of a student population of great diversity – in age, cultural background, ethnicity, primary language and academic preparation – through course materials, teaching strategies and advisement. Teach undergraduate courses in Religious Studies, such as RelS 70A (Western Religions), RelS 99 (Death, Dying, & Religion), RelS 122 (Magic, Science and Religion), RelS 162 (Religion and Political Controversy in the US), and RelS 191 (Religion in America). Hold regular office hours. Work cooperatively with staff, program coordinator, and other faculty. Participate in course assessment activities.
