Among these SEVEN courses, at least TWO Advanced Topics courses (any fields) and at least TWO pre-1750 courses. HIST 189A and HIST 189B are both required within the SEVEN total courses. NOTE: Students who take HIST 153 or HIST 155 to fulfill Area V in SJSU Studies and/or HIST 188 to fulfill Area S in SJSU Studies will complete 26 or 27 units in History because HIST 153, 155, and 188 are 3 unit courses.

Seek consultation with your SSTP advisor in choosing which courses to take from the list below. The courses recommended for you will vary depending on whether you plan on teaching middle school or high school and what grade level you would like to teach.

Check department course listings every semester for topics being offered. Any Advanced Topics course can be taken more than once, but only with different topics. Advanced Topics courses are equivalent to other 4-unit upper-division courses in workload and difficulty. "Advanced" does NOT mean "harder."
