Kristofer Boaz Claspill

Must be an undergraduate student majoring in Justice Studies. Must have completed 80 units by end of spring, 2009 semester. Must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 in major coursework. Must include in the written statement an indication of interest in a career in law enforcement and collaboration of the interest in the form of related work experience, an internship with a law enforcement agency or (a) letter(s) from someone who has first-hand knowledge of the applicant's interest in law enforcement.

Theresa Edel

Must be an undergraduate student majoring in Justice Studies. Must have completed 60 units, of which twelve must be at SJSU, and six units of those in the major. Must have a minimum GPA 3.0 overall, 3.0 GPA at SJSU, and a 3.0 in JS major subjects.

Jeffrey Fontana

Must be an upper division undergraduate student majoring in Justice Studies. Must express a desire to pursue a career in law enforcement. Must have a minimum 3.5 GPA in JS Major Subjects, and a minimum 3.0 overall college GPA.

Paula Stone Hubbell Endowment

Must be a current graduate student in classified standing in the Justice Studies Department. Must have a minimum 3.5 GPA in the last 60 units of college/university work. Must demonstrate a serious commitment to a career in juvenile justice or related fields.

Willard "Huck" Schmidt

Either A: Must be an undergraduate student majoring in Justice Studies, who has completed 60 units, of which twelve must be at SJSU and six must be in the JS major. Minimum GPA 3.0 overall, 3.0 GPA at SJSU. *Or B:* Must be a Justice Studies graduate student in classified standing with at least six units left to be completed, and have a minimum GPA of 3.5 in JS graduate courses.

Charles "Pat" Casey

Must be a student transferring from a community college to the San Jose State University Justice Studies program or Forensic Science Degree program. Attain a Minimum GPA of 3.5. Must detail career objectives and how this award will help achieve those objectives in the written statement.

Daniel P. Lomio

Must be a current graduate or undergraduate student majoring in Justice Studies. Undergraduates must have completed 60 units, of which twelve must be at SJSU and six units must be in the Justice Studies major. Graduates must have classified standing and have at least six units left to complete. Must have a minimum GPA 3.0 overall, 3.0 GPA at SJSU, and graduate students must have a minimum GPA of 3.5 in JS graduate courses.

Gene Simpson and Gordon Silva

Must be a current undergraduate student majoring in Justice Studies. ***Must be a participant in Intercollegiate Athletics.*** Must have a 2.75 GPA overall. Include a typed personal statement no longer than one page detailing your reasons for pursuing a career in law enforcement and how this award will benefit you in achieving your goal. Provide two letters of recommendation, including one from a faculty member.

CAC McLaughlin Endowment

Must be an undergraduate student majoring in Forensic Science with an emphasis in either biology or chemistry (the BS in Forensic Science Program) in the Justice Studies Department at San Jose State University. Students must have either begun or completed one semester of research/internship experience in forensic science. Student must submit a one-page outline of his or her forensic science research project. Student must be a current student member of or applicant to California Association of Criminalists, and be an applicant to or member of the Forensic Science Student Group. Student must have completed 60 credit hours total, 12 units of which are in the forensic science major, and have attained a 3.0 overall GPA with a minimum of 3.0 GPA in the major courses. Two statements are required: the one-page statement detailed on the application form above, and a one-page statement outlining the student's plan and timeline to present his or her research at San Jose State University and at a CAC meeting.

This CAC scholarship is specifically intended for the purpose of funding student research and training. The funds may be used for travel, lodging, attendance and registration at forensic science meetings and to offset costs incurred for research and presentation of results at a CAC meeting.
