Paula Stone Hubbell was called “The First Lady of Parole.” She served the California Department of Corrections as a parole agent for 30 years, and she taught and counseled future agents on the job and students in the Administration of Justice Department at San José State University.

Mrs. Hubbell earned a degree in criminology from the University of California, Berkeley in the mid 1960's. She earned her master's degree in the Administration of Justice Department at San José State University in 1980 and was named graduate student of the year.

She was known for her fantastic sense of humor and deep commitment to her job and to the people she worked with in the Department of Corrections.

Mrs. Hubbell first contracted breast cancer in the late 1970's, and remained active until the cancer spread to her liver. She passed away in 1994 at the age of 54.
