Course Description

This course is designed to provide the student with advanced and diverse, supervised practical experiences within the athletic training profession. Selected on- and off-campus clinical settings are utilized to assist the student in the development of cognitive, psychomotor and affective domain competencies related to the athletic training profession. Students will be supervised on-site on a daily basis by BOC certified athletic trainers (ATC).

Course Goals and Student Learning Objectives

At the completion of this course, the student will demonstrate:

- 1) Accumulation of a minimum of 200 hours of supervised clinical experiences engaged in the practice of various hands-on athletic training techniques at an affiliated practicum site.
- 2) Completion of required clinical proficiencies/competencies associated with this practicum course (see attached schedule) – proficiencies/competencies must be initialed and dated by an Approved Clinical Instructor (ACI) to indicate successful completion.
- 3) Completion of all course evaluation methods as noted in this document.
- 4) Active participation in the orientation meeting, weekly practicum meetings and the final semester meeting by sharing experiences and discussing solutions to problems encountered in the athletic training practicum experiences.

Dropping and Adding

Students should be aware of the current deadlines and penalties for adding and dropping classes.

Assignments and Grading Policy

- 1) Clinical proficiency/competency completion – all required elements.
- 2) Practicum hours log – accumulation of minimum 200 hours.
 - a. ***NOTE*** - A **maximum** of 20 hours per week should be spent in the affiliated clinical practicum site – students **cannot** be **required** to participate in more than 20 hours per week at their assigned practicum site. In the event that a student voluntarily participates in more than 20 hours per week at their assigned practicum site, only 20 hours can be counted toward the required 200 hours for the semester.
- 3) Weekly practicum course attendance and active participation.
- 4) Monthly practicum reflection statements (4).
- 5) Completion of case study – upper extremity injury.
- 6) Completion of written documentation of a lower extremity injury signed by an ACI.
- 7) Evaluation of student by ACI/s at practicum site/s (2).
- 8) Evaluation of ACI/s at practicum site/s (2).
- 9) Self-evaluation of clinical and professional development.
- 10) Signed handbook verification forms (2) for each affiliated practicum site.
- 11) Completion of peer presentation for assigned proficiency/competency material and content.
- 12) Photocopy of current CPR/AED certification per BOC standards (Healthcare Provider, Professional Rescuer or like course) – **due first course meeting**.
- 13) Photocopy of current personal professional liability insurance policy – **due first course meeting**.
- 14) Completion of assigned General Medical Rotation observation experiences with Dr. Robert Nishime at Japan Town Medical Group per the handout distributed in class. Holly will schedule these with Dr. Bob's office.

All relevant course materials utilized for evaluation of the student are due by **May 13, 2013**

This practicum course is graded as credit/no credit only (CR/NC). No credit (NC) in this practicum course will be given if **ALL** of the course requirements are not successfully completed. This supervised practicum course is approved for 1 (one) unit of academic credit. **ALL** proficiency/competency evaluations must be completed with a minimum score of 4/5 (80%) per the Athletic Training Education Program Competency Manual in order to successfully complete each evaluation associated with this practicum course
