This is an activities class for the student who is competent in two of the four competitive strokes, and who is comfortable in deep water.

Course Goals and Student Learning Objectives

1. The development and refinement of strokes.
2. Fun and leadership.
3. Conceptual and practical refinement of the physiological, historical and hydrodynamic principles associated with aquatics.

Classroom Protocol

Typically students who do well come to class prepared and participate daily. Standard swimsuits are required.

Swim goggles are highly recommended. Please bring a water bottle. Class begins five minutes after the scheduled start time and ends ten minutes prior to the end of the scheduled finish time. There will be no make-ups for swim practicum, or the final exam unless documented serious and compelling reasons exist. **It is your responsibility to contact me.**
