Rank: Assistant/Associate Professor level, tenure-track position in the School of Nursing.

Qualifications:

A baccalaureate or higher degree in nursing and current physical and psychosocial assessment skills required. Possession of, or eligibility for, RN licensure in California is required. Master's degree which includes coursework in nursing, education or administration with a Care of Childbearing Families (Maternity) focus. Substantial progress toward a doctorate is required for appointment to a tenure-track position. A doctorate is preferred for appointment, required for tenure. A doctorate and substantial experience are required for appointment to a tenure-track Associate Professor level. Applicants meeting all other requirements who have not yet entered a doctoral program will be considered for a temporary position. A minimum of 1 year recent (within 5 years) experience in Care of Childbearing Families (Maternity) providing direct patient care preferred. Clinical teaching applies toward direct patient care. One year of teaching experience in a registered nurse education program is required. Consideration will be given to candidates with expertise in community-based health care and/or home health nursing, expertise in informatics and/or information technology, and advanced practice as a nurse practitioner and/or clinical nurse specialist. Experience in clinical simulation preferred. Also required: Applicants should have awareness of and sensitivity to the educational goals of a multicultural population as might have been gained in cross-cultural study, training, teaching and other comparable experience.

Responsibilities:

Applicants must be prepared to care for clients in a variety of settings. The integrated baccalaureate program emphasizes the use of the nursing process to provide care to clients of all ages, at points along the health-illness continuum and in a variety of health care settings. Primary responsibilities will be to teach undergraduate and/or graduate courses (normally 12 weighted teaching units/semester). Responsibilities will include a combination of clinical and classroom teaching. Further responsibilities include a commitment to ongoing clinical practice; student advising; service on school, college, and university committees; and general curricula update and development. Teaching effectiveness, service to students and university, and scholarly/professional achievement are required for retention, tenure, and promotion. Candidate must address the needs of a student population of great diversity – in age, cultural background, ethnicity, primary language and academic preparation – through course materials, teaching strategies and advisement.

Salary Range: Commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Starting Date: August 21, 2008

Eligibility: Employment is contingent upon proof of eligibility to work in the United States.
