STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships will be awarded according to the following criteria:

1. Financial need
2. Over-all GPA of 3.0 or better
3. Past work or volunteer experience that indicates credibility regarding occupational therapy as a career choice
4. Personal statement, no longer than 250 words, describing recent leadership and service experiences and future professional plans

GUIDELINES

1. Master of Science in OT Degree Students are eligible to apply in their 2nd and 4th semesters in the O.T. curriculum.
2. Two awards of up to \$2,000.00 will be granted annually. Each application must be reviewed by a committee within the Department of Occupational Therapy. The amount awarded will be

determined by the amount requested, the applicant's qualifications according to the criteria, and the demand for scholarships in relation to the funds available.

3. If the recipient leaves the program for any reason, the amount of the award is to be returned to the scholarship fund.
4. Students can only receive a total of \$2,000.00 from the Wynn Schultz-Krohn Scholarship Fund.

PROCEDURES

Applications are available on the Occupational Therapy Department Website OR in the Department of Occupational Therapy Office (CCB 203). Completed applications are to be returned to the department office where they will be referred to a Scholarship Committee for review. If the application is approved, the student will receive a confirmation letter which is to be taken to the Bursar's Office for disbursement. These letters are typically mailed in June but the awards are for the Fall Semester. Those awardees who have completed their academic course work and will be starting their Fieldwork during the summer will be awarded their money mid-summer. The confirmation letter will specify when you can expect to receive your award.
