# CALIFORNIA ANNUAL SAFETY PLAN REPORT

## In Compliance with Education Code 67380(a)(1) &(a)(4)

### **AVAILABILITY, LOCATION & METHODS TO SUMMON LAW ENFORCEMENT ASSISTANCE**

UPD (University Police Department) is located adjacent to the South Garage at the corner of South Seventh and San Salvador Streets. The physical address is 377 South Seventh Street, San Jose, Ca. 95192. The Police Department is open 24 hours a day; 365 days a year.

#### **Crime Reporting:**

The entire campus community is strongly encouraged to report any and all known or suspected incidents of criminal activity on campus to the University Police Department as soon as possible. When calling the San Jose State University Police Department always:

- Give your name, telephone number and location.
- Give clear and accurate information.
- Be prepared to supply suspect and vehicle description and direction of travel.
- DON'T HANG UP! Follow the instructions of the dispatcher.

#### **Special safeguards for particular facilities or activities include:**

- Video Surveillance
- Panic Alarms
- Duress Alarms
- Card key access to buildings
- UPD Dispatch Center ability to lock buildings
- Review of events (pre-planning for risk assessment)
- Special Event Security Details

To provide for the security of campus facilities, the University Police enforces Educational Code 89031 and Housing Policies. Campus facility access may be revoked per penal code 626.

### **Actions taken in the preceding 18 months to increase safety:**

- Conducted a night-time campus safety walk with campus partners and the local City Councilperson to assess safety and security issues on campus and in the immediate neighborhood
- Taught Run/Hide/Fight active shooter response classes
- Updated the Campus Emergency Operations Plan
- Taught RAD (Rape Aggression Defense) classes
- Established a Chief's Student Advisory Board to solicit student input on public safety concerns
- Conducted full scale evacuation drills
- Added additional protective barriers in MLK Library
- Added gunshot location detection technology to two main areas on campus
- Added video cameras and License Plate Recognition (LPR) capability to the North Parking Garage
- Collected data to assess outreach and prevention efforts by campus partners

### **Changes in safety precautions expected in the next 24 months:**

- Add additional staffing, both sworn and civilian staff
- Install new security phone system in residence halls
- Add capability to deliver audio emergency notifications via speaker systems in classrooms and hallways
- Add IP-based duress buttons to campus VoIP phones and selected potential risk areas
- Add video cameras and License Plate Recognition (LPR) to all parking garages
- Increase number of gunshot location detection devices on campus
- Present additional training and prevention workshops for campus partners on conflict resolution, managing classroom behavior, decision making, anger management, and how and where to report incidents
- Increase assessment of outreach and prevention efforts by campus partners
