Led the transition of student life from a daytime, commuter focus to a 24-hour multidimensional focus on commuter, residential and online students with expanded co-curricular learning opportunities. Refocused the Division of Student Affairs with increased infrastructure in the areas of learning and assessment, programming, policies, and staffing. Increased student involvement by 700%. Built a new culture of campus life through collaboration with academic units, and the establishment of new traditions on the campus. Led organizational change by establishing new policies/practices for campus life, chairing the UMass Boston 24/7 Committee planning change efforts across the University to broaden the scope of educational programming and support services, and by implementing periodic reviews of all Division of Student Affairs departments.

Engaged collaborations with academic departments across the campus including a University-wide steering committee for new student orientation, internship/practicum experiences for Clinical Psychology and Nursing students in University Health Services, faculty education with the Office of Faculty Development, and cadet and internship programs for Sociology/Criminal Justice students in Police and Public safety.
