MEDIA ADVISORY: Changes to 2008 U.S. Olympic Team Processing Media Day Dates

San José , Calif. – The United States Olympic Committee (USOC) has changed the media availability dates for the 2008 U.S. Olympic Team Processing program. The new dates are July 27 and August 1.

Members of the working media and news outlets credentialed by the USOC for the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing can request credentials for any of currently scheduled media days. Available dates and U.S. Teams expected to participate are listed below. The Team Processing facility will be open to media members from approximately 2 to 3:30 p.m. on the selected media days.

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

Media members interested in attending any of the media days are required to submit a credential request at least 48 hours prior to the scheduled media day. Sam will contact you 24 hours prior to the event to acknowledge receipt of your credential request and provide specific details on credential pick-up and other pertinent information regarding Team Processing procedures. Team Processing for members of the 2008 U.S. Olympic Team will take place from July 18 - August 6 on the campus of San José State University in San José, Calif. More than 600 U.S. Olympic Team members, coaches and officials will gather by team at the university prior to departing to Beijing, China. Athletes will participate in team briefings,

apparel distribution, fittings, and medical screenings as a part of pre-Olympic Games activity.
