At its meeting of April 7, 1997, the Academic Senate approved the following Senate Management Resolution presented by Sally Veregge for the Organization and Government Committee.

SENATE MANAGEMENT RESOLUTION ENROLLMENT COMMITTEE

Replaces F92-1, SM-F92-1, UP S89-13

WHEREAS: The feedback obtained from the Retention Task Force stated that operating committees involved in student outreach (recruitment), student enrollment, and student retention, should all report to the senate via the same policy committee; and

WHEREAS: Enrollment management involves attracting students into particular majors, bringing them to campus, retaining them, and making enrollment projections year by year based on anticipated numbers of graduations, departures, new arrivals, and continuing students; and

WHEREAS: Since adjusting any one of these elements automatically influences all the others, a single senate policy committee overseeing the total flow of students would be most effective; therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Enrollment Advisory Committee and the Recruitment and Retention Committee be combined to form a new committee, the Enrollment Committee, reporting to the Instruction and Student Affairs Committee; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the charge of the combined committee shall be: to study problems and recommend policies and procedures relating to all aspects of student enrollment and retention, both long and short term; and to advise the Senate and administrators on appropriate responses to enrollment and retention problems, giving due weight to the special concerns in this area of members of under-represented groups and the implications of enrollment and retention decisions for educational equity; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the members of the combined Committee shall be as follows: Director, Educational Planning and Resources

AVP/Enrollment Services

AVP/Graduate Studies

AVP/Undergraduate Studies

A Faculty Representative from each College

A Representative from the General Unit

Student Representatives (2) (one undergraduate & one graduate preferred)
