At its meeting of September 26, 2005, the Executive Committee of the Academic Senate passed the following Sense of the Senate Resolution presented by Senator McClory.

SENSE OF THE SENATE RESOLUTION

HONORING UNITED STATES SENATOR J. WILLIAM FULBRIGHT ON THE OCCASION OF THE CELEBRATION OF HIS CENTENNIAL YEAR

- Whereas, J. William Fulbright strongly believed in promoting international peace¹, and
- Whereas, He was the author of the legislation establishing the Fulbright Program¹, and
- Whereas, Since the establishment of the Fulbright program in 1946, over 250,000 individuals have participated in the program¹, including faculty and students from San José State University, and
- Whereas, “Many of these individuals have made significant contributions to their countries as well as to the overall goal of advancing mutual understanding¹,” and
- Whereas, Senator Fulbright drafted the Fulbright Resolution, adopted in 1943, which supported “an international peace-keeping machinery encouraging United States participation in what became the United Nations¹”, and
- Whereas, Senator Fulbright’s vision of building mutual understanding among nations and in support of peace is very much alive in the legacy of the programs he championed, and
- Whereas, 2005 is the 100th anniversary of Senator Fulbright’s birth, now, therefore be it resolved
- Resolved, That the Academic Senate of San José State University honor Senator J. William Fulbright and join the world-wide celebration of his centennial year, and be it further
- Resolved, That the Academic Senate of San José State University warmly welcome, Harriet Fulbright, Senator Fulbright’s widow, to our campus and present her with this Resolution.
