Attendees at the events range from 4000-6500 About 50% of the attendees are SJSU students. EDM concerts are popular with students even if they are hosted at other venues. At the event center, some if not all of the risks associated with these concerts are at least being addressed to the best they can compared to other venues. Email blasts regarding prohibited/permitted items are being sent prior to the event; signs are being posted; increased EMS and security officers; UPD personnel; ambulances; distribution of water by pearl angels; misters at lines; check points and amnesty trash bin stations.</li> <li>Cathy also shared that research is carried out and promoters have been carefully selected. The event center works with AEG Live, reputable names in the industry.</li> <li>Cathy informed members that some of the transport numbers reported from the EDM concert incidents were not directly related to the concert but were from separate incidents occurring at the venue vicinity.</li> <li>Members discussed if the event can be restricted to a student only event so that we can control more parameters regarding students' choices at these concerts. This would be difficult to implement as the event center is a public venue and promoters cannot restrict the event to only SJSU students.</li> <li>It was suggested that students need to know how to help their friends with their risky behavior by handing out water.</li> </ul>

However it did not attract as many attendees as it would have hoped. Students/alumni continued to bring in alcohol and tailgate at their cars in the parking lot.</li> <li>Discussion revolved around making south campus safer during games.</li> <li>Suggestion was raised having a similar model like pearl angels distributing water at campus tailgate. Carlos recalled that in the past, there were ambassadors who would distribute water or alert UPD to intoxicated students. However it was noted that UPD personnel must also increase in order to respond to these alerts.</li> <li>Athletics had revised and updated their tailgate policy. Natina is working with Athletics to increase the visibility of the policies</li> <li>Suggestions include controlling the tailgate/entry area through the sale of all inclusive wristbands where attendees can have access to controlled amounts of alcohol beverages, games, food and tickets to the games. This can help curb excessive drinking behavior but still create a safe and fun tailgate space for attendees and encourage them to actually attend the games.</li> <li>Roger advised ADAP to make formal recommendations regarding Game Day and EDM concerts so that the various concerns such as budget, funding, etc can be addressed comprehensively.</li> <li>Liz suggested 2 working groups that will meet outside of ADAP but will report back to ADAP.   - o Liz and Silke met with Stacy in the fall. It was clarified that the function of ADAP is advisory and the committee can report directly to the President. Stacy also shared a sample report with Liz and Silke.

#### III. Tobacco

- COUGH members shared their draft report for tobacco enforcement. COUGH to also share sample report on ADAP folder. The report is based on 3 models: The harm reduction approach, the community organizing model and the spectrum of prevention.
- Recommendations include creating a map to indicate safer spaces for smoking around campus vicinities; better lighting at night, proper receptacles so that students who choose to smoke can smoke safely. Other recommendations include collaborating with PHE to create a curriculum for tobacco; peer mentoring system where students can consult with a PHE/COUGH quit coach; tabling during Earth Day. COUGH recommends a tier system where warnings are first issued, followed by fines. Fines to be used to support tobacco cessation efforts.
- COUGH has reached out to UPD and is waiting to hear back from them.
- COUGH will continue to work on the report
- IV. EDM Concerts and Game Day Drinking Behaviors
  - The reports should contain problem supported by data and journals; best practices at other campus and recommendations.
