Peter Lee Memorial Lecture Featuring Kavita Ramdas

Kavita N. Ramdas is a Visiting Fellow at Stanford University's Center on Democracy, Development and Rule of Law (CDDRL) and Visiting Scholar at the Center for Philanthropy and Civil Society (PACS). From 1996 to September 2010 she served as President and CEO of the [Global Fund for Women](#), providing leadership and direction for the largest grantmaking foundation in the world focused exclusively on supporting international women's human rights.

Ramdas extends her expertise in women's human rights, social justice philanthropy, and international development to a diverse array of professional affiliations. For example she serves as a member of Princeton University's Board of Trustees and the Board of Trustees of Mount Holyoke College and is a member of the Advisory Panel to the Global Development Program of the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.

Ramdas received her academic training at Hindu College, Delhi University, Mount Holyoke College (B.A. 1985) and Princeton University where she earned a Master's degree in Public Affairs from the department of International Development Studies of the Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs (1988). Ramdas is fluent in Hindi/Urdu, English and German and can converse in Tamil, Spanish and French.
