Marina Nemat was born in 1965 in Tehran, Iran. After the Islamic Revolution of 1979, she was arrested at the age of sixteen and spent more than two years in a political prison in Tehran. There she was tortured and came very close to execution. She came to Canada in 1991 and has called it home ever since.

Her memoir of her life in Iran, *Prisoner of Tehran*, was published in April 2007 and has been an international bestseller. Marina has just published her second book, *After Tehran: A Life Reclaimed*. This intimate evening is an opportunity to hear Marina Nemat candidly tell her story of courage, survival and resilience.
