

The Strategic Planning Process and UPC Planning Advisory Panels

"The UPC Planning Advisory Panels are responsible for identifying needs and ideas within key planning areas identified by the University Planning Council, including, but not limited to those identified in UPS04-11 (Section 1.3.1). These Planning Advisory Panels will both inform the UPC and answer questions and requests for information from the UPC. The purpose of having the Planning Advisory Panels inform the UPC is to best ensure that broad and informed suggestions and explanation of campus needs are communicated to the UPC ([Senate Policy F04-3](#), Section 2.2.5)."

Planning Advisory Panels will continue their work throughout the 2006-07 academic year.

"Each panel consists of 6 to 14 people from across divisions and includes faculty, staff, administrators and students as appropriate. Members are selected based on knowledge, representational role, and ability to make appropriate time commitment ([Senate Policy F04-3](#), Section 5.1.1)." The University Planning Council has worked with the Senate Executive Committee to identify the membership and chair of each panel (Senate Policy F04-3, Section 5.1.2)."
