

Enhanced Classroom - Projection Start-up Guide

If you have problems with this system, Dial “O” or 4-2867 from the classroom phone.

While pointing the “Projector Remote Control” toward the projector, press the Power (RED) button. (Wait 90 seconds for the projector warm-up.)

The “Projector Remote Control” is located on the White Board Tray.

A: Computer Projection

- 1: Connect the 15-pin VGA cable and attached audio cable to the monitor and audio-out ports on your laptop.
- 2: Press the input button marked “COMPUTER” on the Remote Control and select “Computer 1”.

(You should see the input displayed on the upper right corner of the projection screen)

- 3: Set your computer’s display resolution to a maximum of **1024x768**.
- 4: Adjust your laptop for either dual or external monitor support.
- 5: Use the volume “UP” and “Down” buttons on the “Projector Remote Control” to control the sound in the room. Sound only comes from the Projector.
- 6: When finished, replace VGA/Audio cable on the hook provided near the connection panel.

(See your desktop support technician for more information on the settings needed for 3 or 4.)

B: To project from DVD/VCR or Other Video Sources

- 1: Connect your DVD/VCR etc. to the Video/Audio connections on the VGA wall plate using your standard video (yellow) and audio (red & white) VCR cables.
- 2: Press the input button marked “Video” on the “Projector Remote Control” to select the Video/Audio inputs.

(You should see the input displayed on the upper right corner of the image on the screen)

- 3: Operate your external source in its normal fashion.
- 4: Use the volume “UP” and “Down” buttons on the “Projector Remote Control” to control the sound in the room. Sound only comes from the Projector.

NOTE: This system cannot be used for Audio Only presentations.

When finished, turn off the projector by pressing the “Power” button on the “Projector Remote Control” **TWICE** (with a pause between each button push) while pointing the “Projector Remote Control” toward the projector.

The projector should display a “Shutting Down” message.
