# **Course Format**

#### **Hybrid/Technology Intensive**

# **Course Description**

This is the second course in the intermediate level of Chinese. This course is designed for students who have taken 25A or its equivalent course. We will focus on the development of the four skill areas: speaking, listening, reading, and writing.

Examples include: Moving into a new place, going to an art and culture event, asking for directions, being a dinner guest, traveling in China, applying for passport and visa, at the bank, and discussing health and fitness.

CLO 4 Students are able to develop awareness of and sensitivity to cultural perspectives and norms and enhance their ability to interact appropriately in communicative situations.

In this course, students will be able to improve their Mandarin listening, speaking, reading and writing ability. The video project will include 5 mini videos of 2-3 min each based on 5 topics from this semester. The total video length should be about 10-12 mins.
