Course Description

This is a course of advanced Japanese and intended for those who have a total of 240-300 classroom hours of training. The class will be conducted in Japanese. The primary focus of this course is on the further development of writing skills through classroom activities and homework assignments. Speaking and listening skills will be developed by group discussions, a short speech and presentation. For the presentation, students will be asked to read other students' writings. To maximally benefit from classroom activities, it is essential that students turn in their writings of a topic covered in the previous class.

Course Goals and Learning Outcomes (CLOs)

To develop the students' four Japanese language skills (listening, speaking, reading, and writing) in three modes of communication (interpersonal, interpretive, and presentational).

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- (1) use and understand socially appropriate language forms in writing on various topics,
- (2) write kanji characters at the kyooiku-kanji level along with hiragana and katakana characters, and (3) be aware of the standard writing style in communicative tasks.
