The Purpose of the Student Organizing Internship Program is to:

- 1) Build the leadership capacity and organizing skills of CSU students as future leaders.
- 2) Develop an ongoing partnership with the student community in the CSU around issues relevant to the University
- 3) Increase student awareness about campus-community labor issues and impact of these issues on the university
- 4) Promote student awareness, empowerment and engagement of social justice and labor issues

Desired Qualifications

4. Ability to develop an ongoing partnership with students around issues affecting the campus community
5. Ability to communicate effectively and clearly with supervisor(s) and peers
6. Ability to manage and coordinate a strong and active student base
7. Majors related to labor History/social justice (prefer, but not limited to)
8. Applicants must be able to make a one year commitment to internship program

Required Qualifications

1. Familiarity with campus
2. Ability to manage time and complete projects in a timely manner [especially with minimal supervision]
3. Ability to adapt to shifting expectations and priorities
4. Self starter and self motivated
5. Willing to learn new skills to perform job duties
6. Good communication skills
7. Good record-keeping skills
8. Willing to travel occasionally throughout California

Duties and Responsibilities

1. Outreach and recruit students on your campus to get them involved in key events & activities
2. Build a base of student activists on campus
3. Build and strengthen relationships with student leaders on campus
4. Assist in organizing campus events to build awareness of issues
5. Create and maintain records of student contacts
6. Attend quarterly/semester trainings
7. Participate in conference calls, as needed
8. Complete bi-monthly reports
9. Take part in District and State Lobby Days
10. Implement statewide campaigns/programs on the campus level
11. Attend Chapter Executive Board Meetings where relevant to the student work
