Course Description

A traditional darkroom photography class which introduces black and white film developing, fiber based printing, and image manipulation and presentation techniques. Taught with traditional film and photo paper; requires a film camera, limited number of which department can loan students.

Course Format

This is a Mode 4 class. Class meetings will take place online at scheduled times with very limited lab access on campus.

Technology Requirements

This course makes extensive use of high speed internet connection to access zoom meetings and online class content. All assignments, readings, handouts, and relevant class info will be located on the CANVAS Portal. You are responsible for accessing these materials when made available (and printing them out if you choose). Due to our efforts to make the School of Art and Design a “paperless” environment hard copies will NOT be handed out in class.

Course Goals

Students will acquire the aesthetic and technical knowledge to create black and white silver gelatin prints. During the course of the semester students will learn a variety of analog techniques including: 35mm format photography, and working with silver based light sensitive materials. The history of darkroom processes leading up to contemporary artists and photographers who use analog processes will also be covered. Aesthetic and

formal considerations in the construction of the photographic print will be a primary focus of this class. Taught with traditional film and photo paper; may require a film camera, a limited number of which the department can loan students.

Course Learning Outcomes (CLO)

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- CLO 1 Operate their film camera to expose film
- CLO 2 learn about how to process black and white film
- CLO 3 Understand manual camera functions and their visual outcomes
- CLO 4 Print their own contact sheets and photographs
- CLO 5 Understand the difference in light and contrast
- CLO 6 Understand controlling contrast in the printing process
- CLO 7 Fine tune printing through the use of tools and manipulation
- CLO 8 Gain familiarity with fine art photography, photographers and concept

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Acquire an understanding of silver-based photographic materials, process, and equipment
- Increase the student's creativity and ability to use photography as a form of self-expression.
- The acquisition of a visual vocabulary and the appropriate way to give feedback during a critique.
- Gain skill in handling and application of equipment and process.
- Become familiar with historical and contemporary developments of photography.
- Learn advanced elements of the photographic image and their application to visual communication and aesthetic appreciation

To keep costs down we will discuss books that you already own and design readings from these.

 - This manual is required reading for every photography student and will help acquaint you with the SJSU Dept. of Art and Art History Photo Lab facility and safety procedures. There is a safety quiz required for all students using the Photo Lab -- passing this quiz is a requirement to use the Lab. The manual, also, contains important information regarding traditional photo processing such as film developing and printing at SJSU. Having a copy of this manual with you while in the Lab will prove helpful.

Grading Information

Since photography is a visual experience, the course grade is largely based visuals produced and other course work that reveals how well you have learned from all sources. Your final grade will be based on 4 smaller projects (40%) a final project (20%), class participation (30%), and Midterm exam (10%).

The work created in class will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

- A **Outstanding:** Handing in all assignments on time and of outstanding quality. Actively participates in class critiques and discussions. Presents thoughtful and intelligent ideas in a clear, organized, and engaging manner. Work is among the very best.
- B **Above Average:** Handing in all assignments on time, and of above average quality. Actively participates in class critiques and discussions. Presents ideas that are interesting and successfully presented; shows potential, but not necessarily distinctive. Work is roughly equal in quality to the majority of work completed by other students.
- C **Average / Mediocre:** Handing in all assignments on time and of outstanding quality. Actively participates in class critiques and discussions. Achieves minimum requirements of the assignment, but not particularly clear, nor ambitious. Quality of work is below that of most other projects submitted. May be above average idea presented in incomplete state.
- D **Unsatisfactory:** does not satisfy the minimum requirements of the assignment; generally unsatisfactory in terms of quality and clarity.
- F You didn't submit an assignment.

Classroom Protocol

Online classes will meet via Zoom during the regular class hours. Questions and comments may be entered anytime during the session in the “chat” box. Students are asked to remain on mute until called on to speak. It is preferred to have student video on. Students are asked to arrive punctually for the Zoom classes.
