Requests for proposal must be for the purpose of enhancing educational experience outside of the classroom while improving the campus climate of San José State University. Additionally, requests for proposals must be aligned with the mission of Associated Students in order to be considered.

The proposal must meet the requirements outlined below and must include supporting documents that demonstrate the scope and impact of the proposed initiative.

Submission: The Spartan Community Fund funding request google form must be completed and all supporting documents should be emailed on the same day of submission to ariana.shah@sjsu.edu in order to be considered. Supporting documents include quotes, estimates, forecasts, invoices, and a preview of the post-assessment report.

Process:

1. Please submit your request in advance of the proposed event
2. A meeting will occur within that month, so please come prepared
3. A decision will be made at that meeting to approve or deny
4. If approved: Expenses will get approved by The Associate Finance Director and Controller
5. A Check will be issued within 1-2 weeks!

Eligibility: The Spartan Community Fund is only available to MOSAIC Cross-Cultural Center, PRIDE Center, Gender Equity Center, Accessible Education Center, International House, the Veterans Resource Center, Black Leadership Opportunity Center (BLOC), UndocuSpartan Student Resource Center, and the Chicana/Latinx Student Success Center (CLSSC/Centro) for the 2023-2024 academic year. Applicants must have a minimum of two San José State University matriculated students as employees and one staff member. Funds awarded shall be disbursed for the purpose of the proposal as stipulated by Associated Students. Applicants may receive funding and/or apply for funding multiple times during the 2022-2023 academic year. Recognized Student Organizations are not eligible for the Spartan Community Fund.

Budget: The Spartan Community Fund amount is \$20,000.00. A single proposal may not exceed \$2,000.

Day of Remembrance (<https://www.sjsu.edu/senate/docs/SS-S23-4.pdf>) an event recognizing the Japanese incarceration in the United States during World War II. As per the AS resolution passed 2023 to institutionalize an annual Day of Remembrance on February 19th, CAPISE is leading a small committee to host a day of education and recognition of the day and work SJSU is doing connected to the continued recognition of SJSU's participation in the incarceration at that time. (February 19th is the day Executive Order 9066 was issued by the President of the United States to incarcerate Japanese living in the United States during World War II.)

We will be hosting a day-long program on Monday, February 19th from 10am - 4pm in the Hammer Theatre featuring 4 different sessions (tentative schedule below):

- 10:30 am - 11:45 am: "Nisei" short film screening and discussion
- 12:00 - 1:15 pm: Lunch and Commemoration: Performance from San Jose Taiko, words from SJSU and City of San Jose officials, and announcement of Mural project
- 1:30 - 2:45 pm: panel discussion about the development of the SJSU "Never Again is Now!" Mural project
- 3 - 4:00 pm: Campus Art Walk tour with SJSU Archivist

The request of \$1500 is meant to cover the light lunch and refreshments we hope to provide for 100 attendees at \$15 per person.

Describe how this proposal will enhance the educational experience outside of the classroom while improving the campus climate of San José State University. *500 words max *

Many of SJSU's student population is unaware of the campus' history and involvement with Japanese incarceration during World War II. By continuing to make space for learning and visibility for this history, this allows students to learn through their own experience about history that they have like learned in class. Additionally, by uplifting the advocacy and stories of how SJSU has come to this place to recognize and address its past involvement, this allows current students to engage in what activism can look like on our campus and how it can change it for the better. This program also engages with our local community, particularly in Japantown, to help our students understand the important relationship we have as individuals and as an institution to build and support the connections between on-campus and off-campus. Understanding our campus' complex history can enhance student investment and interest in seeing what else we can work on to better our overall community as well.

Describe how this proposal is aligned with the mission of Associated Students. *300 words max *

This program directly comes from the legacy of student advocacy and leadership of SJSU's Associated Students. Without the SS-S23-4 Resolution, the Day of Remembrance event would not exist and would not have the strength to be building toward full institutionalization on campus. It is important to note that "Nisei," the short film about one family's experience with incarceration, is the project of an SJSU alum, and San Jose Taiko was founded by SJSU alumni. In these ways, the program also uplifts our students' legacies beyond campus and the impact they are able to make from their time with us, and then to share it back with our campus. At its heart, this program with all its different sessions are meant to provide our current students and our local community with the chance to engage with a grounded learning experience that extends beyond the classroom, which aligns with Associated Students' mission to provide education through high quality programs and services.

Our projected outcomes are:

- + To engage students in learning about the lived history of Japanese incarceration in the City of San Jose and at San Jose State University.
- + To connect the campus community to our larger local community
- + To execute and support the SJSU Associated Students SS-S23-4 Resolution.

The Black Leadership and Opportunity Center (The BLOC), PRIDE Center, and MOSAIC Cross Cultural Center will be hosting our 1st Annual Black Liberation Ball at San Jose State University. The Black Liberation Ball is an exhibition Ball, meaning it is less competitive and more focused on education, socializing, having fun, and showcasing talent in a lighthearted atmosphere. The purpose for the funds will be used to pay our vendor/facilitator, a community organization called "Oakland To All". Oakland To All is a grassroots, community-based effort.





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This event is open to all students and the campus community more broadly, as we seek to engage and educate the community on the history of Black Ball culture within the Black LGBTQ+ community. This event will directly build our campus's capacity to support and amplify the experiences of the Black Queer and Trans community.

Describe how this proposal is aligned with the mission of Associated Students. *300 words max *

This event is directly and intimately aligned with the mission of Associated Students by: 1) supporting the organization's legacy of advocating for a student population that is hyper invisible and marginalized on our campus, further recognizing and supporting the intersectional identities and experiences of the Black Queer and Trans students and 2) providing high quality programming where students can see themselves in a positive and affirming light.

Describe the projected outcomes and provide a timeline of activities (Please email attachments). *

An exhibition ball is more focused on learning and education, mostly adopted by educational institutions and paired with classes, demonstrations, and panels for learning about ballroom history, culture, and excellence. An exhibition ball - a 2-hour event with no more than 4 or so categories, no judges, event curator, a host, a DJ and a commentator.

LO#1 - Build SJSU's capacity to educate and celebrate the experiences of the Black Queer and Trans community.

LO#2 - Expose the SJSU community to the history of Black Ball culture within the Black LGBTQ+ community by through the programmatic form of an exhibition ball

LO#3 - Create opportunities to center the learning and development of Black Queer and Trans students and allies to participate and grow skills in Black Ball culture

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Provide a description of the data or evidence to be collected showing the impact of the results * or whether the desired outcomes have been achieved (to be included in your final assessment report).

As this is an inaugural event, the collective offices will create and disseminate post event evaluations and in person opportunities to better understand event satisfaction, and areas of opportunity for future programming that centers the needs of the Black Queer and Trans community.
