RANK: Assistant or Associate Professor. (Tenure-Track)
One-year visiting professor appointments will also be considered.

QUALIFICATIONS: A strong primary theoretical background in International Business/Global Management is required. A secondary background in Social Issues in Management is desired. The applicants should be able to teach primarily International Business/Global Management courses and secondarily Social Issues in Management courses.

Applicants should have awareness of and sensitivity to the educational goals of a multicultural population as might have been gained in cross-cultural study, training, teaching and other comparable experience. The ideal applicant would be a proficient teacher and researcher seeking a collaborative environment. Evidence of prior teaching excellence is desirable. Candidate should have a doctorate or, if ABD, be able to complete the degree within 12 months of employment.

In evaluating applications, strong preference will be given to candidates who...

- Possess an appropriate doctorate from an accredited university. If ABD, completion of the doctorate may be a requirement for continued employment and will be a prerequisite for promotion and tenure.
- For senior rank must demonstrate a record of quality research, have broad teaching experience and must be willing to assume a leadership role in the field.
- Demonstrate a record of teaching excellence, ideally enhanced by industry experience.
- Have a record of professional achievements and research leading to publications and scholarly papers.
- Have shown an ability to work as part of a team, and have excellent communication, collegiality, and interpersonal skills.

RESPONSIBILITIES: Address the needs of a student population of great diversity in age, cultural background, ethnicity, primary language and academic preparation through course materials, teaching strategies, and student advisement.

ACADEMIC ASSIGNMENT: Undergraduate as well as graduate teaching assignments are expected. While the normal teaching load is 12 semester hours, it is common for individual faculty to teach fewer hours when engaged in approved research projects or certain other assigned University activities. Professional achievements and research leading to publications and scholarly papers are required. Knowledge of computer applications is also highly desirable.

CONSULTING AND APPLIED RESEARCH: Located within the heart of the "Silicon Valley" and within an hour's drive of San Francisco, a major world trade and financial center, opportunities are available for consulting and applied, field-based research.

THE DEPARTMENT: The Organization and Management Department serves approximately 1,600 undergraduates who have declared Management, International Business or Human Resource Management as a major.

THE COLLEGE OF BUSINESS: The College of Business has an enrollment of about 5,500 students in nine undergraduate concentrations and about 500 students in our graduate programs.
