In order to be eligible for the LPCC, you must complete the following requirements:

- 13 core content areas (A – M)

 - Core content areas that **MUST** be completed within degree: Law & Ethics (EDCO 232), Diagnostic Processes (EDCO 282), Assessment & Testing (EDCO 283)
 - All 13 must be completed before education can be approved

- Supervised Fieldwork
 - **Minimum 6 semester units (EDCO 292)**
 - Minimum 280 face-to-face hours

 - *Courses required for PPSC: 227, 287*
