Service Learning

- **Enhance Access to Service Learning Opportunities**
 - Developing new partnerships with community organizations.
 - Designing new discussions, activities, and assignments.
- **Developing Virtual Tools to Improve Supervision**
 - Set up a Facebook group for students.
 - Offered Skype conferencing with classroom teachers and students.
 - Using iPads to videotape students in the field.

Capstone Seminar

- **Tying Capstone to Practica and Service Learning**
 - Connecting developmental theory to practice outside of the classroom.
- **Developing a New Signature Assignment**
 - Addresses Social and Global Responsibilities ULG.
 - Assignment develops students' understanding of poverty, health, education, and family life in other countries.
