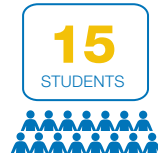

SAT/ACT Scores

Freshman applicants are required to take the **SAT (Math and Evidence-based Reading and Writing sections)** or **ACT** and have their scores submitted to **SJSU**.

Request to have your official scores sent from the testing agency — scores listed on your transcript or on your application for admission will not be accepted as a substitute. **Please note:** The SAT/ACT writing portion is not used for admission or placement purposes at SJSU.

December Exam - You may take the December SAT exam, however, you must rush your scores and risk missing the deadline to be considered for admission.

Average SAT/ACT Test Score - Since SJSU is an impacted campus, we do not provide an average SAT/ACT score. To view how competitive your major has been historically, please visit sjsu.edu/admissions/impaction

Practice Exam - To take a free practice exam to prepare for the SAT, visit khanacademy.org/sat

Submitting SAT and/or ACT Test Scores is a Two-step Process - Submit all test scores from the SAT and/or ACT exams and confirm that your scores are attached to your Cal State Apply file. SJSU will “superscore” or combine test results with like-tests so it is beneficial to send scores from all exams you have taken.

Step 1: Request that your official scores are sent to any California State University. The SJSU SAT code is 4687.

Step 2: Ensure that your scores attach in Cal State Apply by confirming that you have entered the correct College Board ID (for SAT) or ACT ID in Cal State Apply.

Eligibility Index (EI)

SJSU uses your Grade Point Average and SAT/ACT scores to calculate your Eligibility Index.

You must meet the following minimum CSU Eligibility Index (EI) requirements to be considered for admission in our impaction process. This means that meeting minimum CSU eligibility requirements does not guarantee admission to SJSU.

Grade Point Average (GPA)

We calculate your high school GPA using your 10th and 11th grade a–g courses when considering you for admission. Your official GPA for admission to SJSU may be different than the GPA on your high school transcript.

Impaction Criteria (for Freshmen)

Meeting Minimum Admission Requirements Does Not Guarantee Admission.

Admission to San José State is competitive in all majors because SJSU continues to have more qualified applicants than available new student spaces. This situation is called "impaction" and it means that meeting the minimum academic requirements for CSU eligibility does not guarantee admission to San José State.

Freshman applicants who meet the minimum academic requirements will be ranked in each major based on a combination of their self-reported GPA (at the time you apply) and official SAT or ACT test scores (Eligibility Index or EI).

(Please keep in mind the thresholds change each year and that although the Freshman impaction website shows an EI lower than 3570, nonresidents of California must have at minimum an EI of 3570 for admission).

Engineering Majors

Freshman applicants to the engineering programs will be ranked using a modified eligibility index that will give greater weight to the math sections of the SAT and ACT.

Junior Status (60 semester / 90 quarter units)

California College/University Credits

To learn how course credits earned at one public California college or university can be applied when transferred to another, use ASSIST, an online student-transfer information system, at assist.org.

Second Bachelor's Degree

If you are seeking a second bachelor's degree (except for those entering the nursing program), you will not be admitted.

Basic Skills Courses

Complete your four basic skills courses as early as possible. The four basic skills courses must be completed by the end of the Spring 2020 term to be eligible for admission for the fall semester. Courses taken during the Summer 2020 term will not be counted toward the completion of academic requirements for Fall 2020. You must earn a "C-" or higher in each basic skills course.

- 1. One course in oral communication (Area A1)
- 2. One course in written composition (Area A2)
- 3. One course in critical thinking (Area A3)
- 4. One course in college-level mathematics or quantitative reasoning, with intermediate algebra as a prerequisite (Area B4)

Grade Point Average

Earn a college grade point average of 2.00 or better in all transferable courses. Be in good standing at the last college or university attended.

Supplemental Application

To be considered for admission, all transfer applicants must complete SJSU's supplemental application by the deadline posted to your MySJSU account.

Transfer Associate Degree

At SJSU, a California Community College student who has earned the Associate in Arts degree for Transfer (AA-T) or the Associate in Science degree for Transfer (AS-T) will receive priority admission consideration into a similar baccalaureate degree program as long as the student meets all the admission requirements. Verification of degree completion will be required during the application process as well as at final verification prior to enrollment.

Transfers with the AA-T or AS-T degree who do not meet SJSU's impactation criteria (based on their intended major) are not guaranteed admission to a specific major or campus, but will receive priority admission consideration at their local CSU to a program or major that is similar to their associate degree. Impaction Criteria (for Transfers)

Admission to San José State is competitive in all majors because SJSU continues to have more qualified applicants than available new student spaces. This situation is called “impaction” and it means that meeting the minimum academic requirements does not guarantee admission to San José State.

CSU eligible transfer applicants will be ranked in each major based on their self-reported GPA (as reported in the required supplemental application). Some programs will give preference to applicants who have completed program-specific preparation courses. Additional courses have been approved for Fall 2020 admission (sjsu.edu/admissions/impaction).

Majors with (Program-Specific) Preparation Courses

Select majors (degree programs) give preference to applicants who have completed program-specific preparatory courses. These programs are noted in the “Degrees” section and will give preference to students based on a combination of their self-reported GPA and the completion of program-specific, lower division coursework.

For example, if two applicants to the same program have the same GPA, preference will be given to the applicant who has completed the greater number of program-specific preparation courses. Similarly, if two applicants have completed the same number of program-specific preparation courses, preference will be given to the applicant with the higher GPA. The program-specific courses that will be considered are listed at sjsu.edu/admissions/impaction

Fees are Subject to Change

The CSU makes every effort to keep student costs to a minimum. Fees listed in published schedules or student accounts may need to be increased when public funding is inadequate. Therefore, CSU must reserve the right, even after initial fee payments are made, to increase or modify any listed fees, without notice, until the date when instruction for a particular semester or quarter has begun. All CSU listed fees should be regarded as estimates that are subject to change upon approval by The Board of Trustees, the Chancellor, or the Presidents, as appropriate. Changes in mandatory systemwide fees will be made in accordance with the requirements of the Working Families Student Fee Transparency and Accountability Act (Sections 66028 - 66028.6 of the Education Code).

California Residency for Tuition Purposes

The determination of residency for tuition purposes affects whether a student pays in-state or out-of-state tuition fees. Out-of-state tuition fees are higher than in-state tuition fees. Just because a student is or has been a resident of the State of California does not mean that he or she qualifies to receive the in-state tuition rate. Certain requirements, established under California law, must be met.

Housing Costs

Housing rent is based on double occupancy, furnished units with a 10-month contract. Rent includes basic utilities, wi-fi internet access, internet-based TV and furniture. Senior Year Costs

Senior year of high school can also run up quite a tab for families. From prom to SAT/ACT tests to graduation, budgeting can help to ensure a reasonable, but memorable final year in high school.

- ACT/SAT Tests: \$50 - \$90 per test
- College Applications: \$43 (average) - \$90 per application

Optional Costs:

- Test Prep classes for ACT/SAT exams: \$200+ (online), \$600+ (in person)
- High School expenses (prom, pictures, ring, yearbook, graduation, etc.): \$1,500+

Financial Aid

San José State University's Financial Aid and Scholarship Office provides assistance to students in securing federal, state and university financial aid to achieve their educational pursuits. Each year, SJSU awards and administers more than \$500 million in financial aid to eligible students. Students receive aid in the form of scholarships, grants, work study and loans - funds that help them focus on their education and complete their degree. Learn more at sjsu.edu/faso

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

To help cover the cost of attending SJSU, you may apply for financial aid provided through federal grants, state grants, work study and loans by using the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). You can submit your application starting **Tuesday, October 1, 2019**. To ensure you receive as much aid as possible, we encourage you to submit your application by the priority deadline, which is **Monday, March 2, 2020**. You can apply after March 2 but the amount of financial aid that you receive may be reduced due to available funding. Learn more at fafsa.ed.gov

Financial Aid is only distributed after enrolling in SJSU.

Scholarships

Scholarships are generally based on scholastic achievement and financial need. The Financial Aid and Scholarship Office administers three types of scholarships: SJSU campus-based, department-based and private-based. Hundreds of SJSU scholarships are available, ranging from \$250 to \$4,000 per year. Students are encouraged to apply for as many scholarships as possible to lessen the need for loans or part-time work to pay for the cost of attendance.
