FITW Advisory Board Meeting Minutes

December 9, 2016, 11am

- 1. Welcome and Introduction of new members
- 2. Project and Personnel Changes
 - a. Temporary SJSU Lead Pat Backer for Spring 2017
- 3. Budget Status
 - a. New Budget approved by ED in October to reflect new salaries and dropping of Pre-Calculus from roster.
 - b. Budgets are on track, WestEd has modified theirs to reflect a shift in workload and for Shandy Hauk to replace Ted Britton as the PI.
- 4. Year 1 Activities Update
 - a. 2 Presentations this fall
 - i. October- 22nd Annual CELT conference at CSU-Chico, plenary presentation and accompanying workshop
 - ii. November- Poster Presentation at AAC&U in Boston
 - b. Upcoming Presentations
 - i. ASEE Presentation- June in Columbus
 - ii. 2 Pending abstracts at WSCUC in San Diego in April
 - c. Physics and Calculus are currently being implemented.
 - Working with faculty at various levels, depending on their comfort and familiarity with FCM.

- Calculus has had strong group dynamics, collaborative development, and 2/3 reporting satisfactory implementation.
- 2. Physics has had some struggles, working more in parallel than in tandem, but CSULA and SJSU have implemented this fall, CPP will implement in Winter and Spring quarters.
- 5. Follow-Up Discussion: Recruiting Faculty for Training
 - a. Two-tier training program. Faculty will participate in training for \$250 (35 faculty/year) and, upon completion of training, will be eligible to apply for paid time in Year 4 to implement the methods.
 - i. 10 days of summer pay for 15 faculty (7 in Year 3, 8 in Year 4)
 - ii. Expectation is the sharing of the developed content upon completion.
 - b. Training will likely be a 1-day workshop, with follow up in FLCs.
 **Particularly within math, as we are discussing a recruitment for the Calculus I study in Year 3. These faculty may be asked to "participate" in the study in year 3, but not be trained in Flipped Classroom until Year 4.

6. Year 3 Calculus Study

a. Identified greatest challenge is the timing of the Year 3 Calculus Study.
CPP's switch in Fall 2018 to Semesters is affecting the ability to collect consistent data. (Year 3-Spring 2018, Fall 2018; Year 4 Spring 2019, Fall 2019. Grant end date September 30, 2019.)

i. Constraints:

- 1. Don't want to mix semesters and quarters for data.
- 2. Initial design of study had follow up of students' successes in subsequent classes, but if we push to Fall 2018/Spring

- 2019, we won't have the ability to do any follow-up before grant ends.
- 3. Not ideal to collect data in first semester teaching semesters due to the adjustment, but won't have a choice.

ii. Solutions:

- Asking for a no-cost extension. (not likely to be approved at this point, political climate makes this questionable, also).
- 2. Completely omitting CPP from the study.
- 3. Collecting only 1 semester's worth of data from CPP.
- 4. Starting SJSU, CSULA in Spring 2018, and have the time to do the follow-up with them, but stagger CPP to start in Fall 2019. Will reduce follow-up data available for CPP for final report on grant, but will get the study in and have Fall/Spring data for both schools.
- 5. Eliminate stagger of CPP and start in F18.

7. Other Discussion and Feedback

- a. Will be meeting with WestEd and Methodologist
- b. Training will be staggered, part of FLC
 - i. Must attend training to be able to submit proposal
- c. CPP will have more sections which will help data with more faculty
 - i. 30-33 students in Calculus classes
- d. Captioning software/ resources vary by campus/ compliance is increasing
- e. Stipends will only be awarded for the Two-tier training program
- f. Will be creating training for Summer 17
