End of period	10-15 minutes	Posters & gallery walk: Once they have completed their poster, have them display it on the wall, much like at a scientific poster session. One from each group will stay with the poster and help to explain it as the class circulates to look at all of the posters. Students take turns standing by their poster so that each of them has the chance to visit the other groups' posters. All leave Post-It Notes ideas and suggestions for other groups. Overview/Introduction
