Incident Summary:

• 2018137501: It is alleged the on April 19-20, 2019, Pi Kappa Alpha hosted a party with alcohol that resulted in a battery, fight, vandalism and brandishing a firearm. This party was held while the organization was on a Cease & Desist.

2018157701: Students reported to Student Involvement Staff that Pi Kappa Alpha had a "no more parties at SJSU" party on the weekend of April 26, 2019. This party was held while the organization was on a Cease & Desist.

2018157901: It is alleged that on the weekend of April 11, 2019, Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity had a formal in Las Vegas. Members of Alpha Phi, Delta Gamma, and Alpha Xi Delta were in attendance. This occurred while Pi Kappa Alpha was on a Cease & Desist and other university sanctions.

Student Organization Code of Conduct Violations:

- (01)Encouraging, Permitting, Assisting
 - (C) Encouraging, permitting, or assisting another to do any act that could subject him or her to discipline.
- (02) Alcohol
 - A copy of the University's Alcohol Policy shall be provided to each student organization president and must be followed. The University's Alcohol Policy is in compliance with California Law, which prohibits the sale or giving of any alcoholic beverage to any person under the age of 21. Student organizations are in violation of University policy if any individuals under the age of 21 are in possession of alcoholic beverages at an activity sponsored/hosted by the student organization and/or if intoxicated individuals consume alcohol. All student organization presidents must sign an agreement to abide by and uphold the University's Alcohol Policy as well as present an alcohol awareness program to their organizations (should be pre-approved by the Prevention Education Program Center) or arrange for an

alcohol awareness program approved by the Prevention Education Program Center. Student organizations sponsoring events are responsible for following the appropriate procedures to prevent underage drinking, including providing alternatives to alcohol.

- (08) Failure to Comply
 - (A) Failure to comply with the directions of University officials acting in the performance of their official duties.
- (08) Failure to Comply with Student Organizations Handbook
 - (C) Failure to follow all policies and procedures established by the University pertaining to student organizations, including fraternities and sororities, as outlined in the Student Organizations Handbook.
- (12) Guests
 - Student organizations are responsible for informing their guest(s) of University policies and procedures and will be held accountable for the behavior of their guest(s).
- (23) Failure to Comply with Sanctions
 - (G) Failure to comply with the sanction(s) imposed under a student organization discipline proceeding which may result in further disciplinary action and/or additional sanction(s).

Sanctions:

• Suspension as a SJSU Recognized Student Organization (RSO) effective through Fall 2027.

This sanction stipulates that Pi Kappa Alpha will not be permitted to register and/or function as a student organization during the aforementioned time period. Evidence suggesting the active functioning of the organization, or anyone acting on behalf of or representing the organization, during the period of University suspension may result in further review of the organization's status with the University. Violation of terms of Organization Suspension may thus result in additional university-imposed sanctions that may include, but not be limited to, extended suspension and/or permanent withdrawal of recognition. Furthermore, the National Organization may engage in a conversation about the ability of the campus to support re-recognition during Fall 2026 in preparation for Fall 2027. The Organization will need to follow all expansion processes in the Inter-Fraternity Council bylaws in addition to receiving campus approval from the Vice President for Student Affairs.
