UPPER DIVISION AREAS AND DESCRIPTIONS

WORLD HISTORY

155 **WORLD HISTORY.** Examines the fundamental elements of economics, society, politics, and ideology in human culture in historical context. Satisfies G.E. Area V.

AFRICA

105A **AFRICAN HISTORY TO 1800.** The development of the African state and the pre-European empires.

105B **19th and 20th CENTURY AFRICA.** Emphasis on the growth of African nationalism.

ASIA

106 **HISTORY OF THE HOLY LAND.** History of land successively known as Canaan, Israel and Palestine.

107 **SOUTHEAST ASIA.** Southeast Asia since the 18th century. Emphasis on European colonization and emergence of independent states.

109A **CHINA TO 1800.** Traditional societies, from prehistoric times to the 18th century.

109B **CHINA SINCE 1800.** Examines China's revolutions and the process of modernization, and industrialization.

110A **JAPAN TO 1750.** Development of state, society, and feudalism from prehistoric times to 1750.

110B **JAPAN SINCE 1750.** Japan since 1750. Emphasis on modernization and industrialization.

ANCIENT AND MEDIEVAL EUROPE

115 **ANCIENT NEAR EAST.** From 3500 BC to the Roman Conquest. Emphasis on political, cultural, and religious development.

116 **HISTORY OF GREECE.** Ancient Near East and Hellenic world from earliest times to the Roman conquest of Greece.

117 **HISTORY OF ROME.** From the founding to the collapse of the Roman Empire. Emphasis on political, cultural, & religious development.

118 **BYZANTINE WORLD TO 1453.** From the 4th to the 15th centuries. Emphasis on political, economic, and cultural development.

119 **CHRISTIANITY TO REFORMATION.** From Jewish background to the Reformation. Emphasis on institutional & theological development.

121A **MEDIEVAL WORLD TO 1000.** Emphasis on the decline of the Roman Empire, the development of feudalism, & the Carolingian Renaissance.

121B **MEDIEVAL WORLD 1000-1500.** Emphasis on political, religious, economic, and institutional development.

151A **ANCIENT/MEDIEVAL BRITAIN.** Britain, from prehistoric times to 15th century. Emphasis on political, religious, & economic development.

136 **HISTORY OF TERRORISM IN MODERN WORLD.** A study of the historical origins of modern terrorism-both domestic & international.

176 **CIVIL WAR AMERICA.** A topical approach, examining the political, social, economic, military, & ideological dimensions of the war.

122 **THE RENAISSANCE AND REFORMATION.** The European world in transition from 1400 to 1800.

124 **EARLY MODERN EUROPE.** The European world in transition from 1580-1750.

130A **MILITARY HISTORY, TO 1871.** Emphasis on the principles of strategy, tactics, and civil-military relationships.

130B **MILITARY HISTORY, SINCE 1871.** Emphasis on the principles of strategy, tactics, and civil-military relationships.

151D **WOMEN IN BRITISH EMPIRE.** Examines the position of women in relation to economics, politics, and ethnicity.

152 **HISTORY OF THE CITY.** The origins of the city in its several modes within traditional society.

153 **WOMEN IN EUROPE.** Ancient Greece to Modern Europe. Examines women's changing roles in national, economic, and cultural contexts. Satisfies Area "V."

154 **HISTORY OF THE JEWS.** Emphasis on Jewish life and thought within Modern Europe.

LATIN AMERICA

162 **COLONIAL LATIN AMERICA.** From pre-Columbian times to the 18th century. Emphasis on institutional development, missionary involvement, and independence.

163 **19TH CENTURY LATIN AMER.** From the Bourbon Reforms to Mexican War. Emphasis on political, religious, & economic development.

164 **LATIN AMERICA IN THE 20TH CENTURY.** Since 1910. Emphasis on revolution, military rule, economics and inter-American relations.

165 **HISTORY OF BRAZIL.** History and civilization from the Portuguese discovery to the present day.

166 **CONTEMPORARY MEXICO, SINCE 1910.** Emphasis on the influence of politics, economics, & society on revolution, and the rise and fall of the PRI.

167 **INTELLECTUAL HISTORY OF LATIN AMERICA.** Emphasis on the impact of European intellectualism and the development of indigenous philosophies.

172B **HISTORY OF THE AMERICAN FOREIGN RELATIONS, SINCE 1913.** The development of United States foreign relations.

173 **COLONIAL AMERICA.** Examines the communities of colonial North America.

174 **REVOLUTIONARY AMERICA.** Tracing politics & strategy of war for independence.

175 **INVENTING AMERICA, 1800-1860.** Topics include rise of democratic political culture, industrialization, emergence of market economy.

176 **CIVIL WAR AMERICA.** Examines political, social, economic, military and ideological dimensions.

177 **THE U.S. IN THE INDUSTRIAL AGE, 1865-1920.** Economic, social and political history from the end of the Civil War to the achievement of women's suffrage.

178 **CRASH, DEPRESSION AND WAR, 1920-1950.** Emphasis on the two World Wars, the Great Depression, the New Deal, and the Cold War.

179 **COLD WAR AMERICA AND BEYOND, 1950-PRESENT.** Emphasis on McCarthyism, the Civil Rights Movement, and the domestic impact of the Vietnam War.

181 **THE SIXTIES.** Emphasis on cultural issues relating to the Vietnam War. Emphasis on women's liberation, consumerism, and the Free Speech movement.

182 **BUSINESS INDUSTRY & TECHNOLOGY IN AMERICA.** Historical survey of business from commerce in an agricultural society through evolution of corporate structures.

183 **THE AMERICAN WEST.** From the 16th to the 20th century. Emphasis on westward expansion and the formation of the U.S.

186 **ETHNICITY AND RACE IN U.S. HISTORY.** Emphasis on the formation of a multi ethnic society and the experiences of marginalized groups.

187 **U.S. SOCIAL HISTORY.** Emphasis on urbanization, class stratification, labor, and leisure on American lifestyles.

188 **WOMEN IN THE U.S.** A multi-faceted history of women in the U.S. Emphasis on increased access to education, employment, and suffrage. Satisfies Area "S."

189A **CALIFORNIA, TO 1900.** From Spanish discovery to 1900. Emphasis on political, social, and economic development.

189B **CALIFORNIA, SINCE 1900.** Emphasis on political, social, and economic development.
