
The Role of Social Work Faculty

- ▶ Training Social Work students
 - ▶ Ensure students have practical/clinical experiences in Social Work
 - ▶ Conduct research relevant to SW
 - ▶ Lead study aboard groups
 - ▶ Provide community services and engagement

Important Example in Programming

- ▶ Determining if someone call to report child abuse if the child is in low, moderate or high risk
 - ▶ Determining if a patient discharge home from hospital will need continue monitoring and resources
 - ▶ Determining if a homeless client should get priority into stable hosing given the limited resources
- 

Integrating CS+ to Social Work

- ▶ Given the goal of 2015 it will be difficult to integrate CS to existing Social Work curriculum
 - ▶ High demand in SW will not encourage students to learn other skills such as programming
 - ▶ The need for automate will only continue for our discipline

Proposal

- ▶ Fund raising to get support from industry will be able to help encourage students to learn programming
 - ▶ A free boot camp for those students interested in learning programming while enrolled in SW
 - ▶ A certificate program will help encourage students to get more training in this area
