

HOW TO RETURN TO SJSU AFTER ACADEMIC DISQUALIFICATION

IF YOU ARE OUT OF THE U.S. UPON DISQUALIFICATION, YOU SHOULD NOT TRY TO USE YOUR FORM I-20 TO RETURN TO THE U.S.

YOUR SEVIS RECORD WILL BE TERMINATED BY ISSS THE <u>FIRST DAY</u> OF THE UPCOMING SPRING OR FALL SEMESTER IF YOU DO NOT TRANSFER YOUR I-20 TO ANOTHER U.S. SCHOOL. PLEASE TALK TO AN INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ADVISOR AT ISSS BEFORE USING YOUR FORM I-20 TO TRAVEL ABROAD OR APPLY FOR IMMIGRATION BENEFITS IN THE U.S.

If you are eligible to return to SJSU to continue your studies after you have been academically disqualified, you will need to choose one of the following paths:



*If you choose Path #2 Semester at SJSU, you will need to fulfill a 1-year residency requirement to be eligible for practical training (e.g., CPT and OPT) upon readmission. This means that you will have to be enrolled full-time for one academic year <u>after</u> getting reinstated and readmitted to SJSU to be eligible for CPT and OPT. Students who choose path #1 will need to be enrolled for <u>one semester</u> as an F-1 student to be eligible for practical training after they are reinstated.
