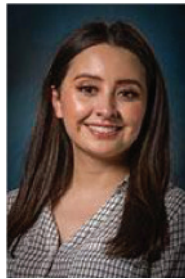

OTHER RESOURCES

Bursar's Office – Main Functions

- Collect payments for tuition, fees and housing; disburse financial aid and process refunds
- Offer payment plans
- Issue SJSU Tower ID cards (for registered students)
- Assist students with questions regarding their student account
- Students can charge up to \$900 per semester for books and supplies purchased at the Spartan Bookstore or ordered online. Charges will be added to your student account. Tower ID card and signed release required when picking up books and supplies each time.
- When you return home, students and parents should determine how you are going to budget for their education. Have a plan!
- Students can sign-up parents as authorized users via my.sjsu.edu account. This will allow parents/family members to view the balance on their account or make payment. It also allows Bursar staff to discuss student's account with parents.

Financial Aid & Scholarships - Main Functions

- Apply online at www.FAFSA.GOV or www.caldreamact.org (AB540)
- Applications open Oct. 1 every year with a priority deadline of March 2
- Check MySJSU frequently for messages and award notice
- Fee deferrals are placed on accounts with all To Do Items submitted prior to June 29
- Financial Aid Fee Deferrals do not defer Housing charges. Contact Housing Office directly for a housing extension.
- Student Sub/Unsub loans offers must be “accepted” on the student portal.
- Disbursement of aid begins the first week of classes.
- Submit in-person the “Student Authorization to Release Information Form” if your student wishes someone to have access to their financial aid information.

Registrar's Office - Main Functions

- Maintain the integrity of students' record
- FERPA – Students must give Signed Consent for parents to access records
- Address changes, name changes, grade issues, grade option changes, etc.
- Issue copies of official SJSU transcript
- Provide enrollment verifications
- Manage registration (2 registration periods: Advanced and Late)
- Post grades on MySJSU account (grades are not mailed to students)
- Reminder to read all MySJSU messages (tutorials available at my.sjsu.edu/)
- Award degrees (undergraduates) and print diplomas

Student Transition Process

- First 4-6 weeks is a time of great transition for students as they experience:
 - ◊ Sense of excitement and independence
 - ◊ Homesickness/anxiety
 - ◊ Roommates or new commuting routine
 - ◊ Meeting new people and trying new things
- By October/November
 - ◊ A routine develops and campus feels more comfortable
 - ◊ Exams
 - ◊ Seasonal allergies, illness is made worse by a lack of sleep and wellness
 - ◊ Preparing for Thanksgiving break and returning home
- November/December
 - ◊ Friendships become the main source of support for students
 - ◊ Coursework and exam preparation intensifies
 - ◊ Stress over signing up for next semester's classes
 - ◊ Anxiety about working over the break or going home

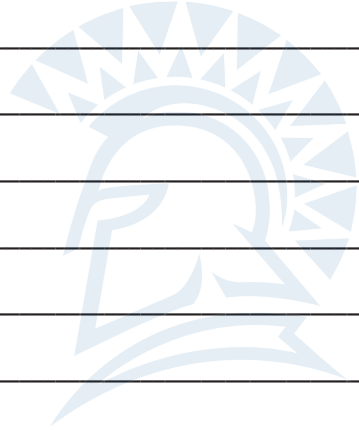

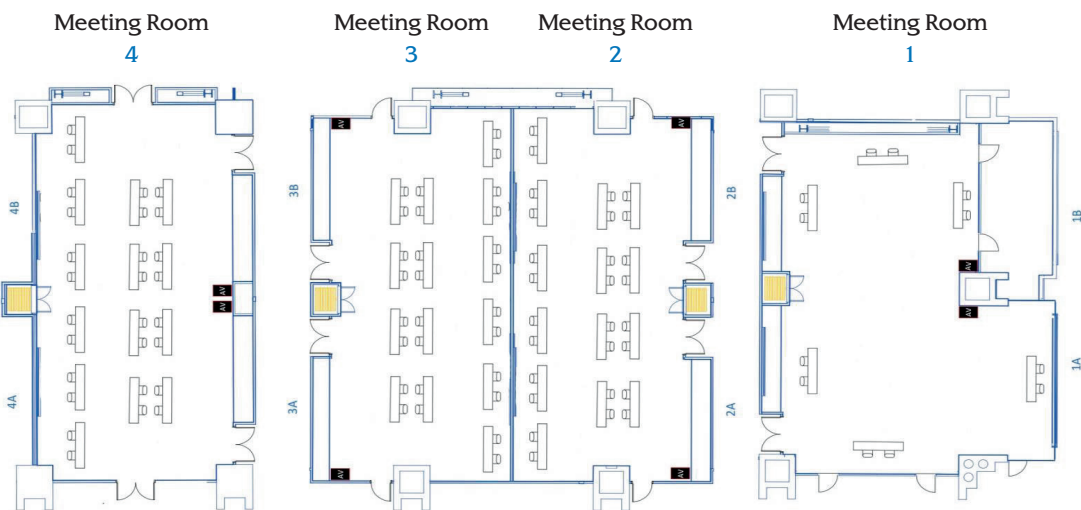

• Accessible Education Center

- ◊ Comprehensive center providing students with accommodations and services.
- ◊ Works closely with faculty, staff, programs and departments to deliver services and promote access for students with disabilities in the classroom and throughout the campus.
- ◊ Service Eligibility: students must self-identify and meet with a counselor to determine service eligibility.
- ◊ AEC Testing Center: state of the art facility designed to provide an optimal environment to support test accommodations.
- ◊ Center for Accessible Technology (CAT): provides students with one-to-one and small group training on adaptive computers and specialized software.
- ◊ Alternative Media Center (AMC): provides curriculum based materials in alternative formats.
- ◊ Deaf and Hard of Hearing Program (DHOH): provides effective communication in support of curriculum access.

• Immunization Requirements

- ◊ New and readmitted students are required to present proof of Measles, Rubella, and Hepatitis B immunization prior to first day of classes

- ◊ Beginning June 25, 2018, immunization documents can be uploaded at www.sjsu.edu/studenthealth/online_services/index.html using your MYSJSU access
- ◊ Deadline to upload is August 20, 2018

- ◊ Adjudicate violations, educate students foster critical thinking
- ◊ Adjudicate group and individual conduct violations (Greek, Club Sports, RSO's)

ABOUT SJSU

Mission

"To enrich the lives of its students, to transmit knowledge to its students along with the necessary skills for applying it in the service of our society, and to expand the base of knowledge through research and scholarship."

History

◇1857◇

SJSU was founded as Minn's Evening Normal School in San Francisco, CA, earning its reputation as the oldest public school of higher education in the state.

◇1862◇

SJSU becomes a California State Normal School and has 54 graduates, all women, from a three-year program.

◇1882◇

California's economy begins to improve, and populations begin to rise. San José Normal School opens a branch in Los Angeles that eventually becomes UCLA in 1927.

◇1892◇

Responding to a decrease in the number of male students and the demand for athletics, San José Normal School organized their first football team.

◇1933◇

San José Teachers College earns a national reputation in football, and ground is broken for Spartan Stadium on S. 7th Street.

◇1941◇

Enrollment plummets as a result of the war. 4,200 students and alumni served in WWII.

◇1942◇

"Spartans" wins the vote as the official mascot!
Go Spartans!

◇1962◇

San José State College wins the national judo championship!

◇1968◇

Tommie Smith and John Carlos stage a protest at the Olympics, raising their fists in the Black Power salute as a silent protest for human rights.

◇1978◇

SJSU International House, home to U.S. and International students opened. This year is the 40th anniversary of the I-House.

◇1997◇

Disney's movie "Flubber" with Robin Williams has scenes filmed in Washington Square Hall.

◇2003◇

In partnership with the city of San José, the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Library, a 475,000 square foot building opened.

◇2005◇

Campus Village buildings are open, housing up to 3,000 students!

SJSU FUN FACTS:

- **Tower Hall** is the official campus logo. It is the oldest building on campus and has the first and largest classroom on campus, Morris Dailey Auditorium. It was named a State Historical Landmark in 1982.
- **Olympic Statues:** During the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City, United States track athletes Tommie Smith and John Carlos were awarded medals for their athletic efforts. However, the great athletic feat would soon be shadowed by one of the most memorable moments in the American Civil Rights Movement. Tommie Smith and John Carlos would protest the poor treatment of African-American people in the United States and stood to empower the African American community. This is a great symbol for the community of San José State University. Tommie Smith and John Carlos were both students at this prestigious university and showed San José State University students of the present and the future that students can make a difference on the global stage. Carlos described why he did it: "...for those individuals that were lynched, or killed and that no-one said a prayer for, that were hung and tarred. It was for those thrown off the side of the boats in the middle passage."
- **The César E. Chávez Monument: Arch of Dignity, Equality and Justice** was designed by Judith F. Baca in 2008. The monument is a 22-foot tall arch topped with a glass eagle, the U.F.W.'s emblem. Decorative tile murals depict people, concepts, symbols and historical events central to Chávez's life and the movement he led. A circular mosaic path surrounding the arch represents the many pilgrimages taken by thousands of people during U.F.W. marches. In the evening, lights illuminate the arch.
- **Associated Students House:** In 1897, Associated Students was founded to provide representation and services to students at San José Teachers College. Since then, the organization has evolved from a student club to a fully operational student government entity. This Victorian-style house once known as the Scheller House, was renovated starting in the Fall of 1999. In 2001 it was reopened and Associated Students, SJSU moved in. The large front door of the downtown San Jose bar, the Continental, is the front door of the original Scheller house. (The bar is located at 349 S 1st Street.)
- In 1942, the old gym now named **Yoshihiro Uchida Hall**, after SJSU judo coach Yosh Uchida was used to register and collect Japanese Americans before sending them to internment camps. Coincidentally, Uchida's parents and siblings were among those processed in the building. Yoshihiro "Yosh" Uchida is a local businessman, entrepreneur, and educator and best known for his contributions to judo. Uchida has been the head judo coach at San Jose State University for over 60 years, and has played a leading part in the development of the university's judo program. Uchida represented the United States as the team coach of the first Olympic Judo Tournament at the 1964 Summer Olympics in Tokyo.
- **The California State Normal School Bell** is currently located in the Spartan Rose Garden. The bell was commissioned for the California State Normal School in 1862. Weighing in at 3,000 pounds, the bell rang every morning at 8 am until the 1906 earthquake. In 1910 the bell was reinstalled in the main building of the newly constructed Tower Hall where it was rung on special occasions. In the early 1960's, seismic concerns led to its retirement and relocation to ground level.
- **The Spartan Rose Garden** was reestablished on the campus of San Jose State University in 2007 to mark the school's 150th birthday. Prior to this, the Spartan Rose had been chosen as the official flower in 1957, and grown in beds along the Central Classroom Building.
- **The SJSU Botany Garden** is one of a handful of green spaces in the city of San José dedicated to California's native plants. The Garden had its origins in the mid-1980s when a 4000-square-foot lawn outside Duncan Hall was cleared and converted to a home for native plants and a habitat for wildlife. A recent grant from the Stanley Smith Horticultural Trust has funded the creation of an internship program in which students learn about the propagation and cultivation of California native plants. Additionally, the Botany Garden is now a registered site with the National Phenology Network (NPN), in which long term patterns of phenological shifts associated with climate change are being observed and recorded in the NPN database.
- **The Spartan Memorial** was erected as a memorial to SJSU students who served in WWII, and is now a non-denominational facility
- **The SJSU Heritage Gateway Campaign** was the 1st university-wide capital improvement campaign in the 140-year history of the institution. \$1.5 million in pledges funded the construction of the eight gateways placed at each one of the main streets leading into campus. The gateways were designed to strengthen the identity and image of the campus by enhancing beauty and creating a more open campus environment with downtown residents and businesses. The gateways are named after the donors. Ex: Boyce Gate

STUDENT RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

As members of the academic community, students accept both the rights and responsibilities incumbent upon all members of the institution. Students are encouraged to consult the Student Responsibilities and Rights section of the SJSU catalog (available online only) to ensure an understanding of the resources, requirements, and programs designed to support students' academic and personal growth, as well as review important university policies and procedures every student at SJSU is responsible for knowing and upholding.

Academic Accommodations

San José State University is committed to providing an inclusive environment that is responsive to the needs of all students. To promote and ensure this inclusion, appropriate accommodations guaranteed by law are provided to individuals who have verified disabilities (PD 1997-03). Faculty, staff or students with questions, concerns, or disagreements about a requested accommodation should contact the AEC and speak with a counselor or the director (408-924-6000).

ADA Compliance

Accessibility for individuals with disabilities is a priority at San José State University. Concerns of the alleged discrimination should be presented to the Office for Equal Opportunity (408/924-2130, 924-2142). Disputes between faculty and students pertaining to accommodations prescribed by the AEC should be presented to an AEC counselor, Associate Director or the Director. Grade disputes and similar issues should be presented to the University Ombudsperson (408-924-5995)

Appeal of Probation or Disqualification

In cases of error or extenuating circumstances, students, upon receiving notice of probation or disqualification, may petition the Academic Disqualification and Reinstatement Review Committee (ADRRRC) to appeal the action (SIO-6). After review of the petition, the ADRRC will make a recommendation to the Associate Vice President for Graduate or Undergraduate Studies to confirm or rescind the action.

Discrimination, Harassment, and Retaliation

San José State University is committed to creating an atmosphere in which all persons and groups can work and study free of unlawful discrimination. Any student who has a complaint regarding unlawful discrimination or harassment should follow the complaint guidelines outlined in the CSU Executive Order 1097 and complete the Student Complaint Form For Discrimination/Harassment/Retaliation Complaints and return it to Office for Equal Opportunity (408/924-2250).

FERPA, Student Records, and Privacy Rights

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Acts ("FERPA") and California State University Executive Order 796 afford students the right to inspect and review their education records; request amendment of an education record believed to be in error or misleading; limit disclosure of personally identifiable information contained in an education record; and file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the University to comply with FERPA. Students who have concerns related to FERPA or potential privacy violations are encouraged to contact the Office of the University Registrar.

Grade Disputes and Grievances

The Student Fairness Committee is under the jurisdiction of the university's Academic Senate and is guided by Senate Policy S14-3. This committee hears complaints of violations of student rights in instructional and curricular matters, including grade appeals, and, when appropriate, makes recommendations for remedy. The committee also hears and seeks remedy of non-instructional student grievances concerning individual members of the faculty, administration or staff and, when appropriate, makes recommendations for redress. Students are encouraged to contact the University Ombudsperson to discuss the informal and formal resolution processes.

STUDENT RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES (continued)

Graduation and Change of Major Appeals

Under the guidelines of PD 2009-05 students may appeal the denial of a request to change/add a major or minor, assignment to a major not of his/her choice, and/or the assignment of a graduation date before his/her term of choice. This appeal must be made within one semester by filing a Petition to Appeal a PD 2009-05 Decision with the Office of Graduate and Undergraduate Programs. The petition must include both an explanation and evidence of any extenuating circumstances that would justify an exception, such as health issues, military service, or similar circumstances.

NCAA Compliance

The purpose of the SJSU Athletics Compliance Program is to ensure that institutional staff members, student athletes and external constituents are aware of and abide by the rules and regulations set forth by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), Mountain West Conference (MWC), Western Athletic Conference (WAC), Mountain Pacific Sports Federation, and San José State University (SJSU). The goal of the SJSU Athletics Compliance Program is to take a proactive approach in its compliance effort by educating, overseeing, and monitoring the Athletic Department and maintaining a positive compliance environment.

Required Immunizations

New students are required to submit proof of “MMR” vaccination or immunity and “Hep B**” vaccination or immunity prior to the start of your first term of SJSU classes (or risk a HOLD on enrollment). For more information go to www.sjsu.edu/registrar/students/immunization. (*If under 18 on 1st day of classes)

Student Conduct and Academic Integrity

Members of the SJSU community are expected to demonstrate academic integrity, accountability for one’s actions, respect for oneself and one’s community, and personal development. It is, therefore, important that students familiarize themselves with the Student Code of Conduct and Academic Integrity Policy for which they are accountable. Both documents are available at www.sjsu.edu/studentconduct/. Students who have questions about either process are encouraged to consult CSU Executive Order 1098 and/or contact the Office of Student Conduct and Ethical Development.

Title IX

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, is a federal law that prohibits discrimination based on the gender of students and employees in education institutions that receive federal assistance. The guidelines are outlined in Executive Orders 1095, 1096, 1097, and 1098. Students who have a complaint, question, or concern regarding Title IX are encouraged to contact the Title IX Officer (408-924-7289).

San Jose State University is committed to providing a supportive learning environment and fostering safe, healthy relationships for the whole community. Title IX requires higher education institutions to take steps to help prevent sexual violence and to respond promptly and effectively when an assault is reported. To fully comply with Title IX, the California State University Chancellor’s Office issued Executive Order 1095 which mandates training programs to help prevent sexual violence.

As such, **all incoming and continuing students** are required to complete mandatory online training on sexual assault prevention on an annual basis. 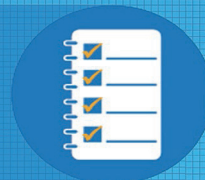

ACADEMIC SUCCESS—CALCULATING YOUR GPA

GPA Calculation

1. Letter grades have numerical values (See chart below)
2. Grade points are derived by multiplying the numerical value of the letter grade by the number of units the course is worth.
3. Units are numerical weights or values assigned to individual courses. These weights/values are also referred to as “course credits.”
4. “Total Grade Points” are derived by adding up the grade points of all courses in a semester (or several semesters depending on what GPA you are trying to calculate- term or SJSU cumulative GPA)

How to Calculate Your Grade Point Average (GPA)

Your grade point average (GPA) is calculated by dividing the total amount of grade points earned by the total amount of credit hours attempted. Your grade point average may range from 0.0 to a 4.0

The College of Applied Sciences and Arts is initiating a requirement for all students in the college to participate in an international experience prior to graduation.

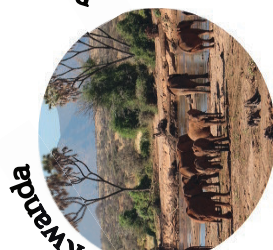
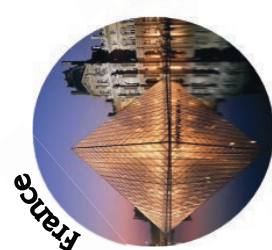
The goal of CASA's international experience requirement is to introduce students to international and intercultural perspectives in order to prepare them to live and work in an increasingly globalized world.

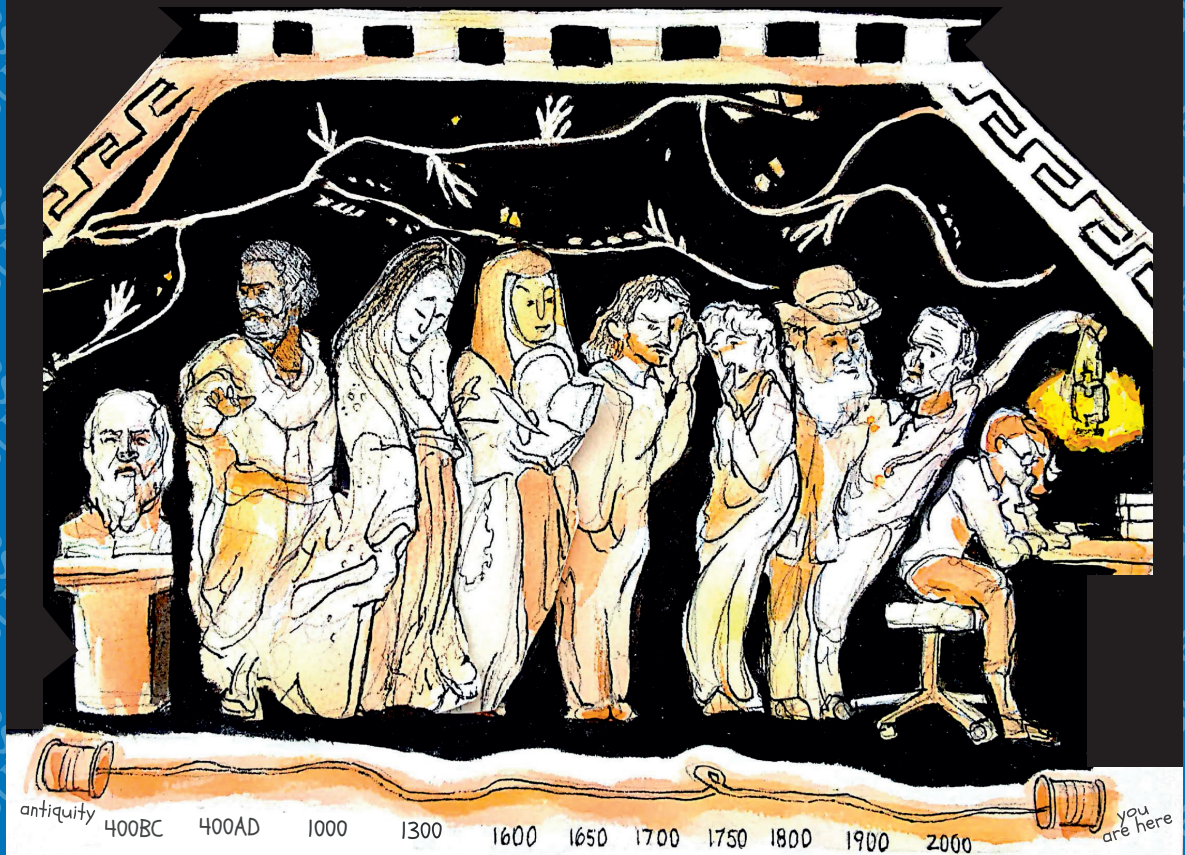

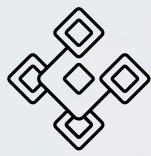

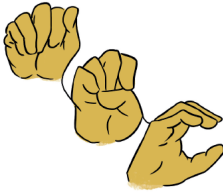

New students attending San José State University will notice several differences upon coming to campus. Some of these differences can be seen in the registration process for disability services, the accommodations students receive, and the level of involvement from family and faculty. All of these changes can be overwhelming; the Accessible Education Center (AEC) will help students transition to life at SJSU with resources in understanding the differences between high school and college, learning strategies and skills, and the resources available to you as a student.

The Accessible Education Center (AEC) at San José State University has facilitated academic accommodations & retention services to students with disabilities since 1972. AEC works closely with students towards creating an accessible and cooperative learning environment at SJSU.

Students need to contact the AEC to schedule an appointment with a counselor. Documentation of a disability submitted to the AEC should be appropriate to both verify a disability and to support requests for accommodations, academic adjustments and/or auxiliary aids.

Accommodations that have been used at previous schools may not be the same accommodations prescribed at SJSU.

Please refer to the AEC web site for specific information about disability documentation guidelines.

Services

Center for Accessible Technology (CAT)

The Center for Accessible Technology (CAT) staff provides assistive technology training and alternative media to students registered with the AEC. Students receive one-on-one and small group training on adaptive computers and specialized software. CAT includes an open computer lab with Macintosh and PC workstations.

AEC Testing Center

AEC Testing is a state of the art facility designed to provide an optimal environment to support test accommodations.

Alternative Media Center (AMC)

AMC provides curriculum based instructional materials in alternate formats, such as Braille, accessible PDF, and Clear Formatted Word documents.

Deaf and Hard of Hearing Program (DHOH)

DHOH provides professional Educational Sign Language Interpreting and Educational Real-Time Captioning services.

The priority filing deadline is March 2nd, annually

Both applications open each year on October 1st

2. Students receive an acknowledgement notification in MySJSU account confirming receipt of application. If selected for verification, documents will be placed on To-Do list. Please check your To-Do list often!

3. Evaluation of award. This could take 6-8 business weeks

4. Award notification and disbursement of aid at beginning of semester
