



FAQ: Peer Advisor Program



1. Which classes have Peer Advisors?

Peer Advisors won't be working in classrooms. They'll work within the College Success Center.

2. Are the advising sessions conducted online or in-person?

At this time, all peer advising sessions are conducted virtually. When in-person classes resume, we will likely offer virtual and in-person peer advising sessions.

3. What are the responsibilities of a Peer Advisor?

The role of the Peer Advisor is to support students through their personal, social, and academic endeavors at San Jose State University. The Peer Advisor will serve as a connecting link between students and the SJSU community by providing campus-related resources, information, and referrals.

4. How are advising sessions conducted?

Peer advising sessions are currently being conducted on Zoom.

5. What are the qualifications of a Peer Advisor?



It's the same as the other peer educator qualifications at Peer Connections.

6. What is not part of the Peer Advisor's responsibilities?

Peer Advisors are not Academic Advisors. Students will need to meet with an Academic Advisor if they need assistance with class advising.

7. How much does it cost to attend an advising session?

All Peer Advising sessions are free!





8. What is expected from students who attend advising sessions?

Students can expect Peer Advisors to listen and support students in their personal, social, and academic situations and skills development

9. How can the students become Peer Advisors?

It's the same process as becoming a peer educator at Peer Educators. Simply apply when the application pool opens.
