Last August, in my Fall Welcome Address, I announced my intent to forever commemorate February 19 as a Day of Remembrance on our campus. A [Presidential Directive](#) formally declaring this designation is now in effect, and while no written proclamation can undo the damage done to those affected by the fearmongering that prompted the incarceration campaign, it will hopefully serve as a step toward acknowledging wrongdoing and ensuring that it never happens again.
