At San José State, we are providing trauma-informed support centered on understanding and empathy. Recognizing the distinct breadth and depth of experiences in our community, we remain focused on ensuring that our campus is a place where all students, faculty, and staff feel heard, respected, and cared for. We encourage open dialogue, and also acknowledge that avoidance of the conflict and focusing on healing is vital to some community members' health and wellbeing.
