Yesterday, San José State received notification from the federal Department of Education's Office of Civil Rights (OCR) related to its investigation regarding past SJSU women's volleyball teams. The letter indicates that the year-long inquiry is now concluded, and the Department has shared its findings and a proposed resolution agreement with the University and the CSU Chancellor's Office. The University is reviewing this information now.

We want to assure our community that San José State is committed to ensuring that all of our students are treated fairly, free from discrimination, and afforded the rights and protections granted under federal and state law, including privacy rights.

SJSU has been fully engaged with the investigative process and remains transparent in our steadfast compliance with all applicable state and federal laws, and NCAA rules.

In navigating shifting federal interpretations of federal law and regulations, our focus remains on upholding our responsibilities as we support and protect every student, staff and faculty member. Our primary goal is to always ensure the health, safety and wellbeing of all members of our community.

San José State will continue to uphold the values that define us as an institution. We remain steadfastly committed to our role as a place of learning, respect, and opportunity for all.
