2yr plan for Transfer Students without their WST (after Fall/07)

This plan assumes that you are transferring with 60 semester hours, and have completed your Core GE, American Institutions, and Physical education requirements at your community college. A maximum of 70 community college (lower division) units can contribute to the required 120 units for graduation. **This planner assumes you had not yet passed the Writing Skills Test¹ prior to your first semester at SJSU.**

As Psychology majors, we assume you have completed the lower division Psychology core at your community college (equivalent to Psyc 1, Stat 95 and Psyc 30) and the human biology supporting course (equivalent to Bio 21 or 65). If you have taken any other Psychology courses at your community college, be sure to check with a Psychology advisor at SJSU to see if the extra course can count as the "upper or lower division Psychology elective". If you attended a College on the quarter system, be sure to meet with an advisor to discuss the number of psychology units that transfer.

In the table below, year refers to year at SJSU. These correspond to your junior and senior years.

You do not NEED to declare a minor. If you choose not to do so, any university-level course from any department can replace the "minor" classes.

³ PSYC 100W fulfills the SJSU studies "upper division GE" requirement for area Z (writing). It is advantageous to finish PSYC 100W as soon as possible.

(note 1) You must take and pass the Writing Skills Test before enrolling in Psyc 100W. Take the WST at least 6 weeks prior to registering for classes. We urge you to take the test immediately after completion of Eng 1A and 1B.

(note 2) STAT 95 is a prerequisite to PSYC 100W. PSYC 100W is required. PSYC 100W is a prerequisite to PSYC 120. PSYC 120 is a pre- or co-requisite for PSYC 190.

(note 3) One of the three required PSYC electives can be a lower division (LD) PSYC course. The others must be upper-division (UD) PSYC courses.
