Isamu (3) – main character; aka Sam
Mama (3) – Sam's mother
Bunji (3) – Sam's brother; 3 years younger
Akemi (3) – Sam's sister; 6 years younger
Yasubei (7) – Sam's father
Kojiro (9) – father's best friend in Hawaii
Fujiwara-san (17) – master carpenter and stonemason; becomes Sam's sensei
Yuriko (43) – young Japanese woman with Mr. Bidwell
Genzo Matsuyama (60) – mother's stepbrother, Sam's uncle; a farmer in Lodi
Dewey (70) - Genzo's son; Sam's cousin
Al Yanagi (70) - Dewey's friend; Keiko's brother
Shoji Yanagi (71) - Al and Keiko's father; Genzo's best friend; owns noodle shop restaurant
Kuwano (71) - Shoji's wife; Al and Keiko's mother
Keiko (71) - Al's sister
Mitsy and Haru (74) - Keiko's friends
Mrs. Franklin (75) - widow Sam works for in Lodi
Nobutaro (81) - Kuwano's older brother in Japan
Misa (127) - Japanese woman Keiko meets on ship to Japan
Miyazakis (197) - couple who buy the Yanagi's restaurant

KEY LOCATIONS

- Honura village in Japan where Sam's family is from; near Hiroshima
- Hilo, Hawaii - location of the plantation where Sam's father works
- Lodi, California - where Sam goes to live with his Uncle Genzo after he finishes high school

HISTORICAL TIMELINE

(for some of the events noted in the story)

July 2, 1937 - Amelia Earhart disappears
December 7, 1941 - Japan attacks Pearl Harbor
August 6 & 9, 1945 - US drops atomic bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki

Haole - Hawaiian for foreigner
Issei - first generation Japanese immigrant
Mochi - rice cake made from pounded rice

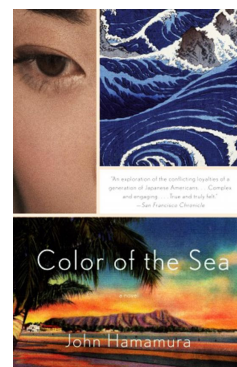
Nisei - children of Japanese parents who are born in a different country

- What did you like most about the story? What did you like least?
- Who are your favorite characters? Why?
- Who are your least favorite characters? Why?
- Which scene was most memorable for you? Why?
- Who are Sam's most important teachers? Why?
- There are many themes in the story – growing up, survival, love, war, fear, keeping promises, and others. Which resonates most for you? Why?
- How has Sam been shaped by the different places he has lived and the people he has interacted with?
- Where is Sam's home?
- On page 5, Sam's mother told him he was starting a great circle of his life and he would return someday and close the circle? What did she mean? Did Sam close a circle when he returned to his mother's home?
- Why does Sam see his name change as a theft while his father sees it as a gift? Do you agree? (pg 14)
- What did Fujiwara-san mean when he asked Sam what the color of the sea was?
- Why does Keiko apologize to her mother for being so American? (pg 82)
- Would you have given the story a different ending? If yes, what?

- ✓ Born in 1945 in Minnesota in an Army hospital.
- ✓ Says he was born into the stories of *Color of the Sea*. His grandparents and aunt were interned at Rowher in Arkansas. His father's hometown was Hiroshima. His father served in the US army training Japanese-American translators.
- ✓ *Color of the Sea* is his first book.
