Who Should Attend?

This free, two-day workshop is for MSI/PUI faculty, postdocs, and research development professionals interested in pursuing NIH funding for their research. Learn the most fundamental pieces of grantsmanship that are broadly applicable to academics at different stages of the application process.

What Topics Will be Covered?

Presentations will cover a variety of material specific to advancing your NIH application process. In addition to a focus on writing the Specific Aims and Project Description, other topics will cover the Biosketch, Data Sharing Plan, and requirements for Rigor and Reproducibility and the Resubmission Process.

Who is Presenting?

The University of Kentucky [iMERS program](#) will present the workshop. Their [team](#) includes experts in proposal development and grants administration and faculty with an active research history. They will share their perspectives, experience, and guidance for navigating the complex NIH grant application process.
