## NSF DELAYS RELEASE OF THE 2020 PAPPG

The National Science Foundation (NSF) typically releases its annual revised version of the *Proposal and Award Policies and Procedures Guide (PAPPG)* during the month of October. However, during a recent Federal Demonstration Partnership (FDP) meeting in Washington, D.C., Jean Feldman, head of the policy office at NSF's Division of Institution and Award Support, announced a delay in the release of the updated 2020 guide.

Ms. Feldman shared that the agency released a draft of the PAPPG this summer to allow for public comment, and received 105 comments from stakeholders. As a result, a working group has been formed to "consider feedback and to develop proposed responses." Before the agency can develop an updated version, comments for revisions must be submitted to senior NSF management for its review and consideration. The updated version must then be cleared by the Office of Management and Budget before it can become final. It is anticipated that the entire process could take several weeks. Consequently the agency has not announced a new posting date. **The February 2019 version of the PAPPG will remain in effect until the agency implements the new 2020 guide.**

## USDE ADVANCES THE CURRENT ADMINISTRATION'S STEM PRIORITIES

In its November 8 press release, the U.S. Department of Education announced its investment of \$540 million to support science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) education (including computer science) through discretionary and research grants in Fiscal Year 2019. In accordance with the current Administration's directive, the investment is intended help increase opportunities in STEM-related career fields. The funding aligns with the overall goals of the five-year federal STEM education strategic plan entitled *Charting A Course For Success: America's Strategy for STEM Education*.

Approximately \$345 million of the total investment "supported continuing the work of current grants that support STEM activities that have demonstrated that they meet all applicable grant requirements, including making substantial progress towards fulfilling the aims of their project proposals." Funds are intended to "be used to prepare the STEM teacher corps, provide graduate student fellowships in areas of national need, increase the number of low-income students who are prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary education, and support state efforts to expand and improve the transition of high school Career and Technical Education (CTE) Students to postsecondary education and employment through apprenticeships, among other areas."
